I certainly hope this finds you safe and well, both physically and mentally! We are all to be congratulated for doing our part during this pandemic to flatten the curve and keep the demands on our medical providers and first responders somewhat manageable. Keep it up!

I thought you'd like some news about the Rosarian business that continues, albeit in a different manner from our traditional methods. The Council has had two virtual meetings since early March and in addition to addressing typical program work, we have approved six excellent new members via a SurveyMonkey secret ballot. That brings to eight our new member Class of 2020. The New Member Knighting is currently scheduled for July and we're

Other Rosarian business includes our elections process that is underway. I've heard from many of you asking after a "do-over" of sorts for this year's Prime Minister and Council. I really have appreciated your heartwarming sentiment and support. However, since 1912, the Royal Rosarians have faced a few years of extreme situations and yet have moved ahead in our leadership selections. Despite the disruptions and cancellations caused by the pandemic, the Prime Minister term of office and election process will go on in the traditional manner. More details are included in this Royal Update edition.

Although our April and first May Membership Meetings were cancelled, we are planning some type of gathering on May 21st. You will be notified of the game plan in the next few weeks. The June 11th Membership Meeting that features our elections is still on the calendar, although its offering may also be in a non-traditional manner given any current restrictions.

And how about the 2020 Rose Festival?! Planning is underway for a late summer offering of events and hospitality to match whatever Rose Festival program is approved by the Mayor and City Council. Currently the preferred dates are September 4th through 13th. Stay tuned for how this all comes together. You can visit the Rose Festival website via the link below for the latest information.

Meanwhile, the Royal Court has been active online with storybook readings and other offerings, and yours truly has a video posted with poetry readings honoring April's National Poetry Month. We are also working with the Rose Festival Foundation to participate in a "Porch Parade" on the last weekend of May (when Starlight Parade was originally scheduled). Royal Rosarians will be asked to drive the Porch Parade route and cheer on participants.

Additionally, the 2020 Rose Garden Contest has morphed into a community celebration. Past garden winners are being asked to allow a showcasing of their street-side gardens and these would be included on the Porch Parade route! Again, stay tuned for more details as these plans come together.

Here's to the expanded Cheer & Outreach Committee and their offerings for our care and enjoyment! I hope you are enjoying the weekly Chaplain's Corner emails and hope you'll join in on one of the virtual socials weekly on Saturday's at 5:30 pm.

Masks have been made by talented seamstresses and delivered to doorstepts. Rosarian Angels have sent flower bouquets here and there. And thanks to donations from the wooden Shoe Tulip Farm, we delivered hundreds of tulips to Meals on Wheels People to include in their meal deliveries. Blooms bring joy!

Council Elections

As we find ourselves in very curious and uncertain times, we all probably have some questions about the upcoming Royal Rosarians elections that will take place June 11 (scheduled for the June 11 membership meeting).

First, be assured that the elections will take place on June 11. As of this date, the June 11 meeting is still on the calendar. On the chance that the meeting might not take place (because maybe a large gathering is not yet appropriate), procedures are being developed that will ensure the integrity, security and transparency of our June11 elections. The Royal Rosarian Edict assumes "inperson" voting (and expressly forbids proxy voting), and if alternate procedures become necessary you can be assured that that requirement will be met with a paper ballot, ballot security, and the high level of integrity in the ballot counting process that Royal Rosarian elections have long had.

The Council has passed several necessary motions to smooth the nomination process with procedures to let the membership know who the candidates for the 2020-21 Council are, and for Secretary of State. Names of those presently running for Council are set forth elsewhere in this issue. There are two candidates for Secretary of State: John Danielson and Mike Ware.

The Edict provides that all candidates be introduced at the April Membership meeting. Since the April meeting was cancelled, the slate of candidates will be published in the Tuesday Report twice in April and in the Royal Update at least once in April, and in all issues of both publications until May 21 (date of the second scheduled May meeting).

The Edict also provides that nominations from the floor may be made at either the first or second membership meetings in May. Because the first May

meeting has been cancelled and the second May meeting may be cancelled the Council approved an alternate process for receiving nominations "from the floor". This shall be satisfied by soliciting additional nominations in the Tuesday Report and Royal Update. Then nominations may be made by emailing or calling both Royal Regent Don Thacker and the Prime Minister with the name of a nominee, on or before May 21, 2020. The membership shall be notified in writing (via Tuesday Report and/or Royal Update) by June 1, 2020 of the names of candidates who were "nominated from the floor" and have accepted and are qualified to run.

The Royal Rosarians have remained strong since 1912. We survived two world wars, several national health crises, and some severe economic disruptions. We will, together, emerge from these uncertain times as strong as ever.

Candidates for Council

There are nine elected Council positions who wear green capes, and three appointed Council positions who wear the red capes. One of the nine elected Council is the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State automatically succeeds to the office of Lord High Chancellor the next year and then to Prime Minister the year after that.

As stated in the preceding article elections will be held on June 11. To date there are ten candidates. Two of which are running for Secretary of State. Nominations for the elected council will remain open until May 21. I you have a nomination call or email both Royal Regent Don Thacker and Prime Minister Kmberly Bown.


