Veterans Day Parade & Post Parade Reception



Monday, November 11

The last parade of the calendar year and the first of Prime Minister Kimberly Bown's year is the popular Portland Veterans Day Parade in the Hollywood District. The 45th annual parade begins at 9:30 a.m., at NE 40th Avenue and NE Hancock Street then travels east on NE Sandy Boulevard to NE 48th Avenue. In addition to the Royal Rosarians, parade participants typically include veterans, marching bands, the honored

1st Marine Division Association, historic military vehicles, veterans' organizations, and veterans' motorcycle groups. Last year's parade featured nearly 2,000 participants.

Following the parade there will be a memorial flag raising and wreath presentation at the Veterans' Memorial on the corner of NE 48th and Sandy near Ross Hollywood Chapel, the host and founder of the parade.

A light lunch will be hosted by Duke Rick Saturn with beverages immediately following the parade at his home 1950 N.E. 62nd Ave (62nd & Tillamook). Feel free to bring a small salad or desert. You can also visit the Saturns before the parade.

Date: Monday, November 11

Time: Parade begins at 9:30 a.m. (Royal Rosarians to assemble at 9:00 a.m.)

Where: Meet in McDonald's parking lot, 2000 NE 40th Ave.

Uniform: Dress whites, with gloves, hats, and capes. Women wear pants. Have rain gear (coat and

hat cover) available if needed.

Parking: Best parking is near the end of the parade route. To avoid closed streets park South of

Sandy and East of 47th.

Royal Rosarian Traveling Float

The traveling float has undergone a new design and will be taken to a new level. It will be torn down to the chassis and rebuilt in a lighter material to carry passengers in addition to the Queen or Prime Minister. If all goes as planned, it will also be an expanding float that can pull double duty as the traveling float most of the year and transform into the Grand Floral Parade Float during Rose Festival and then back to the traveling float. To make this happen, the float team enlisted an engineer to design the substructure of the float. The float will be designed around a Portland theme and remain that theme for several years. This will save time to update the float between years.

The first step is to deconstruct the current float so it can be measured properly, get serviced and have the trailer upgraded as well. The tear down session was held on the weekend of October 26-27. The float committee needs your help to get it rebuilt and ready for the 2020 parade season. Progress and information on work sessions will be available at the November 7 membership meeting and in future Tuesday Reports and Royal Updates.
