Only three such buildings have been known to existone in St Paul, Minnesota; one in Moscow, U.S.S.R.; and our own in Leadville which was the largest, taking up three acres. A skating rink, a ballroom, and a dining hall were housed in the palace. Unfortunately, a chinook wind in January of 1896 was the demise of the ice palace. Temperatures up to 65° F gave the palace the chance of a snowball in hell. A sad story, but very entertaining. Thank you Darlene Weir.


