Bernie's interview with Ashley Patterson

This year, our Club's focus is on developing the Blackwood community, acknowledging leadership, building relationships and partnerships. An integral part of Blackwood is the business community, and this interview was the second in the series focusing on businesses that support our Club. Last month we hosted Reinhardt Van den Berg from Fuji Xerox, and this month we host our long-term supporter Ashley Patterson from the Waggon Wheels fruit and vegetable shop.

Ashley gave a few (not too personal) details of her background, coming from a family with a history of involvement in fruit and vegetable sales. She and her family have experienced the changes in the industry caused mainly by greatly improved transport systems and the impact of world markets. She is passionate about fresh fruit and vegetables and enjoys the relationships with people that result from the business. Waggon Wheels employs more than 30 people, and Ashley acknowledged the challenges involved in running this business.

The major point of difference for her business is the quality and freshness of the produce she sells. Ashely has good relationships with her suppliers and believes this provides the business with supply of the best quality at a price that is beneficial to all parties. While she does not pursue produce that is grown outside Australia, the diversity of our country ensures that most products are available for most of the year. While Blackwood customers are more satisfied to buy produce that is "in season", there is some customer demand for some "out of season" produce that is sourced from overseas.

- Karyina Reserve rebadging
 (New signage is being planned by Council and they do not appear favourably disposed towards naming it Rotary Karinya Park. They were amenable to a new sign with the Rotary Wheel having prominence. Bernie will continue liaising
