- Hands On Project building of prosthetic hands fitted to landmine victims in Vietnam and Cambodia plus assembly of Birthing Kits to assist vulnerable women and newborns in underdeveloped areas of the world to survive and hopefully thrive.

#### 3.1 Agreement to conditions of funding

The Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community Grant Program is designed to generate awareness within the general public of the availability of funds or funding from the Rotary Club of Mount Barker. The members of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker work hard to raise this money and the Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community Grant Program will help us effectively deal with the large numbers of requests that we receive for support each year.

This is designed to be a funding model that does not guarantee or offer funds on a recurring basis.

The pool amount is set at an amount determined by the Board of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker, with a minimum of \$15,000, to be divided at the discretion of the Community Grant Committee of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker. Applications for part funding of your project will be considered. Larger amounts will also be considered.

The purpose of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community Grant Program is to offer not for profit community organisations, clubs, individuals, cultural & environmental groups & associations funding for their needs and / or projects in the Mount Barker Council district.

The Rotary Club of Mount Barker does not intend or condone the use of this community grant program to be used for monetary profit but insist that it is used by the above mentioned, not for profit organisations / individuals, to achieve their goals.

Applicants seeking community grant funding must ensure that the project meets with all federal / state laws, and also meets local council guidelines. Please check relevant websites.

#### 3.2 Limitations

The Rotary Club of Mount Barker will not consider, nor approve applications whose primary purpose is to promote religious beliefs, political beliefs, individual or sporting prizes, projects already completed, and especially events / requests that contravene the guiding principles of Rotary, the 4 way test as under:

- 1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?



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- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

#### 3.3 Assessment Criteria

All applications for a Rotary Club of Mount Barker community grant will be assessed on the following:

- Adherence to the Rotary core values, as underlined in the 4 way test
- Benefits to the community
- Demonstrated community support for a project and / or activity planned
- Measurability of outcomes

#### 3.4 How are the Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community Grants assessed?

The Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community Grant assessment panel, consisting of 4 members appointed by the board of directors of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker, undertakes the role of assessing all applications, based on the before mentioned assessment criteria.

The Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community Grant assessment panel will recommend those projects and / or activities that most meet the values and expectations, underlined in the assessment criteria, and present these to the board of directors of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker for final approval.

If your application is successful, you will be notified in writing by the club, and you will be invited to attend a Rotary Club of Mount Barker grant presentation evening where you will be given the opportunity to outline your project.

If you are not successful, the club will be in contact to advise why you were not successful and advise how you may wish to apply again in the future, to gain a better chance of approval.

All grants MUST be spent in the manner in which they were granted, within 12 months. Any unspent monies must be advised to and returned to the Rotary Club of Mt Barker.



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#### 3.5 Recognising the Rotary Club of Mount Barker's Contribution

One of the conditions of receiving funding through the Rotary Club of Mount Barker Community grant program is that the recipients recognise the support / contribution of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker.

This can be achieved by the following methods:

- Include the Rotary emblem on any printed materials (Proof to be approved by Rotary Club of Mount Barker)
- Acknowledge the support / funding of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker in any press releases, articles, media, or outline programs
- Attend our meeting and present to the members the aspirations and / or results of our grant
- Invite and / or acknowledge members of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker at your event
- Recognise the contribution of the Rotary Club of Mount Barker with on-site signage (Proof to be approved by Rotary Club of Mount Barker)

The Rotary Club of Mount Barker also retain the right to use and / or promote any photos or promotional material on our website or social media platforms.
