At our meeting on Tuesday 5 November, we had as Guest Speaker DG Tim Klar and Bronwyn. This meeting was held at the café at Minda becase the Motel was booked for a Melbourne Cup function.

Also present was **AG Kate Davies** who introduced Tim and Bronwyn to the meeting.

DG Tim advised that currently District 9520 has 1200 Rotarians in 48 clubs and as of 1 July 2020, D9500 and D9520 will amalgamate into District 9510 with close to 100 clubs.

Tim reminded us of the 5 core values of Rotary: Service, Fellowship, Diversity, Integrity and Leadership.

Our RI President, Mark Maloney has set a number of aims for this Rotary year including:

- Grow Rotary
- Build paths for Leadership
- Build Rotary's Strategic and Enduring Plan with the United Nations

Tim reminded us of administrative changes which are coming and asked us all to be ready for these changes.

Rotary online courses are available for members to become more familiar with technological changes which in the long term will benefit individual Rotarians.

Tim concluded his presentation with a promotional video of the upcoming **District Conference in Mildura** from 27 to 29 March 2020.

Also on Tuesday **5 November, Bronwyn Klar spoke** on her project for the year, **ShelterBox.**

We have supported ShelterBox for many years as one of the prime International relief projects which always comes to the rescue when natural or man made disasters interrupt the lives of people around the world.

I think it will be likely that we will purchase another ShelterBox again this year.

Changes to ShelterBox contents include the addition of a large capacity solar powered light and an improved water purification "Thirst Aid" station.

On Tuesday 19 November, we heard from **Bill Stupple** from the **SA Sea Rescue Squadron**.

The Sea Rescue Squadron is a volunteer organisation based at West Beach with other bases at Wirrina, Edithburgh and Wallaroo.

It was formed in 1960 as an organised search and rescue group to assist the police when persons were reported missing at sea.

The SA Sea Rescue Squadron is a primary resource of the SA Police for water rescue and also works with the Coast Guard on similar occasions.

Besides being a primary response group, the Sea Rescue Squadron monitors marine radio channels 24 hours per day, 7 days a week.

They offer free marine radio checks to the public on 27MHz Channel 88 or VHF Channel 16. They encourage boats heading out to sea to log on when departing and logging off on return.

The squadron offers regular courses in Seamanship and Marine Radio to educate ther boating public. The Seamanship qualification is accepted by the SA Department of Transport as sufficient to obtain a Boat Operator's Licence.

Marine Radio Courses are offered in various categories and certificates of competence are issued on behalf of the Australian Maritime College.

It is an offence to operate a marine radio without such a qualification.
