### Past Meetings (Continued)

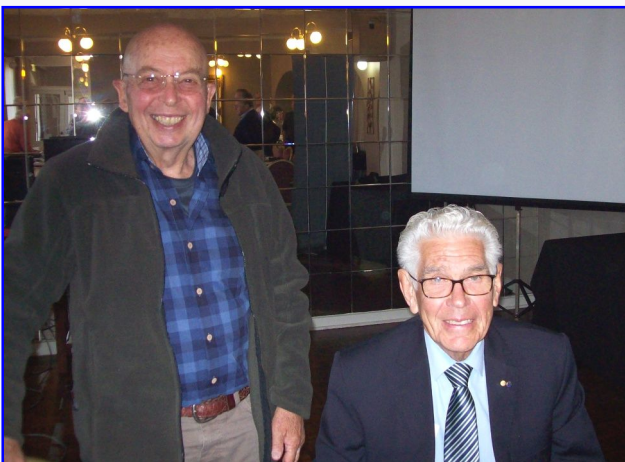
At our meeting on Tuesday **17 September**, we had as Guest Speaker PP David Binks from the Rotary Club of Glenelg.

### Antibiotics or Not

I was interested to read an article in the September edition of *Rotary Down Under* discussing the growing problem of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) which occurs when micro-organisms in our system evolve to become resistant to antibiotics.

Most of the antibiotics we have in our systems come from the food we eat but also the increasing use of prescribed antibiotics for the wrong reasons, primarily viral infections, is cause for concern.

Australia is the 11th highest user of antibiotics in OECD countries.

Antibiotics have only been with us since the 1940's and since that time, millions of human and animal lives have been saved through their use.

However, within two years of penicillin being produced, reports of bacterial resistance to the drug began to occur. This pattern has continued as each new antibiotic was put into use.

Today we are seeing bacteria (Superbugs) which show multiple resistance to almost all antibiotics on the market.

This is a major threat to human and animal health. By 2050 we may be living in an era where we have no antibiotics available to treat simple infections.

The Rotary Club of Mandurah Districts (WA) has commenced a "Wash Your Hands" project in an effort to reduce the transfer of bacterial infections and so reduce the need for the use of antibiotics.
