Past Meetings (continued)

On **Tuesday 15 March**, we were fortunate to have as Guest speaker, **PP Bob Koehne** from the RC Stirling (D9510).

Bob is involved with a number of water and sanitation projects on behalf of Rotary in **Timor Leste**. The provision of clean water and waste sanitation in Timor Leste was a District International project during PDG Peter Ochota's term as District Governor in 2007-2008 and has been successful in achieving desired objectives in some regions of the country since then.

Timor was left in post colonial disarray after the withdrawal of Portugese governance and West Timor was taken over by Indonesia with East Timor gaining independence.

As a very poor country with poor sanitation and poor health facilities, it had one of the highest infant mortality rates in the world.

With the help of Bob and others in Rotary, the province of Aileu, inland from the capital city of Dili, had water from springs in the mountains captured and piped to holding tanks in a number of villages, At the same time (2008-2010), these villages were equipped with toilet facilities and the villagers themselves were educated to use these facilities rather

that "open defecation". The spread of disease was slowed, the village water supply remained unpolluted and the health of villag-

ers was rapidly improved.

This system of sanitation and treatment of waste is working well and the processes are followed up and maintained on a regular basis. Training of villagers is a regular part of these continuing visits.

It is hoped that extensions to other villages will continue.


