D'Arcy reminded us of the magnificent work overseen by ROMAC, Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children from Pacific islands in Australia and New Zealand. ROMAC has been functioning successfully for 33 years and has been responsible for changing the lived of hundreds of children under the age of 15 years. Across both Australia and New Zealand, 40 to 50 children are treated each year at an average cost of around \$35 000 each.
