This week there was no-one as we had Club Assembly. Each committee reported on their activities for the last 12 months, the highlights as follows.

Vocational: Sent a student to Hands On Science Week, Manned a site for the Otago Rally and received \$350.0 for our efforts. Organized the sightseeing activities for the incoming GSE Team from New Jersey and assisted them at Conference. Competed in and won the EJ Trophy grassarama challenge then organized and ran the next EJ Trophy challenge. Supported the Heritage Homes Project

Youth: This year our annual museum visit did not eventuate due to staffing problems at the museum. Sponsored Rachel Patrick as a RYLA exchange student to Germany. Selected two for Ryla. JR McKenzie Trust, approached schools in our area but no takers. Assistance was offered to the Circle of Courage cycle tour as it passed through Mosgiel. Supported the Heritage Homes project

International: Supported the Shelter Box program by purchasing a box. Supported the Cook Island dental care program with a \$1500.0 donation and then encouraged other clubs to participate raising a total in excess of \$12,000. Ran a very successful Rotary Auction night which raised over \$7300.0. We have two couples going to Spokane, Washington USA in September on a Rotary Friendship exchange.

Community: Ran the chocolate wheel at the market day. A very successful outing. Organised and ran the Heritage Homes Tour. This huge event raised over \$10,000 which was spent on fluro vests for all the primary school children on the Taieri. Organised the refurbishment of one of the huts at the Tirohanga Camp site. Did the Chapel Bed Pushing at the Dunedin hospital on two occasions during the year.

Club Service; without this group of dedicated members the club could not survive. **W**e had home hosting, venues, bar, secretary, treasurer, programs, guest speakers, sergeants, etc etc. Thanks guys.

EXTRAS; These were the extra activities that took off simply because the opportunity arose and the job needed to be done. First off was the "Baldies" fundraiser which although started a year earlier was kept going and continues to raise money for the Children's Cancer ward at CHCH Hospital.

The second major event that required the full support of the club and a lot of extra effort by the organizing committee was RYLA. Our club took on this challenge and made it a huge success. I am sure it had a major impact on the lives of those that attended.

The Black Tie Ball; rather than see it not happen this year a dedicated group got together and organised and ran this successful event. There was even a profit of \$2500 which was donated to the new playground in Mosgiel.

Talk about going beyond the call of duty, Congratulations and thanks to all those members for all their hard work and keeping the name of Rotary alive in the community.
