**3 minute talk.** Colin gave a brief run down on how three local companies beat the world. The Aleutian Islands (between Alaska and Russia) are in danger of loosing a species of native bird due to a rat infestation. The rat eradication program was put up for international tender. The NZ consortium of **Otago Helicopters** (supplying the pilots and expertise) **Tracmap** (GPS guidance and traceability tracing) and **Stainless & Alloy Fabricators** (make and supply the spreader buckets for under the helicopters) beat the world and won the tender. Well done guys, teamwork and co-operation.

OUR GUEST SPEAKER: This week our own member Colin Brown gave us an informative talk about his company TRACMAP. After many years in the agricultural industry Colin could see that in the future there was going to be a need for accurate fertilizer spreading and proof of placement. After all he had already seen stiffer rules and regulations bought in to monitor the amount and types of chemicals being used in the fruit and especially apple industry. As Colin was quick to point out, if it was happening there it wouldn't be long before the rest of the farming industry would have to comply. In 2005 Colin was in an electronics company looking at GPS systems for boats when the penny dropped. From here the seed was sown and so the research was started. He purchased the company any by using their expertise and contacts, the seed was planted. Initially the GPS system was designed for the accurate spreading of fertilizer. Colin has always held the belief that the best way to success is to employ those who know more than you in specialized areas. By using a range of specialist company's from around NZ and overseas the first prototype was in field trials by August 05. Since then there have been several versions and now Tracmap is successfully selling and installing Tracmap systems into fertilizer and chemical spraying trucks. Another variation has been developed specifically for the K line irrigation system in the dairy industry. This has really taken off. Another version is for the aviation industry and is now in production with a major helicopter company as the major distributor. Selling into Australia is now underway.

It all comes down to having a product that people find easy to use, is robust and reliable and there is a need for. Colin and Tracmap have found a niche market in a field that is rapidly diversifying and changing and they are prepared to evolve with it. Not just to follow the trends but to be the leader of innovation in that field. Tracmap now employs 13 staff, 6 of whom are in the sales field. Keep up the good work.
