End Polio Walk at Singapore Botanic Gardens – 8 April 2017

Some 400 Rotarians, family members and friends walked around the Botanic Gardens early morning on Saturday 8th April to raise awareness and funds to End Polio Now! Flagged off at the Nassim Gate by PDG Zainie Abdul Aucasa, we walked leisurely on a cool which later turned out to be a rainy morning. We went on a trail to collect 12 Polio fact cards that shared information about Polio and Rotary milestones through the years for this cause. We of course visited the sculpture Passing of Knowledge built by our Club in 2003.

Rotary, along with our major partners Bill and Melinda Gates, has reduced polio by 99.9% worldwide since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines. We have immunised over 2.5 billion children worldwide. Given multiple times, polio vaccine can protect a child for life. Polio vaccination was introduced in Singapore in 1962. Singapore was certified polio-free in 2000 but children continue to receive the vaccine as part of the National Childhood Immunisation Programme.

Rotaractors and Interactors participated as ushers to help in making the event a great success. The Walk is organised across the District by District Family Chair Dolly Yeap. RC Singapore West sponsored the Polio fact cards.

A DAY IN BATAM BETESDA HOME



Rotractors and Rotarians have to work side by side to embody the true spirit of Rotary Club. It is all about touching the life of the children and bringing a 'smile' on their faces that has the power to change this world by restoring faith, peace and happiness. This is what we had in mind when on 1st April we took young Rotractors to visit our Betesda Home, an orphanage in Batam, Indonesia. It was the first trip for the Rotractors. Our aim was to help young Rotractors experience the 'joy of giving' and inspire them to work in cooperation to make an impact. We wanted them to utilize their Time, Talent, Treasure and Thinking (4T's) in rendering selfless service to the adorable and enthusiastic kids. And, we believe we had been able to successfully achieve the aim we had set for this trip.

Early morning, we assembled at Harbourfront Centre and boarded the 8:40am ferry to Batam, Indonesia. All were very excited to meet the kids. Upon arrival, we met Pastor Zebua at Batam Centre Ferry Terminal and he brought us to the Home in a minibus. Upon reaching the Home, he gave a heart-touching speech about the backgrounds of each kid and their various needs. Thanks to Rotarian Deepti Lalchandani for preparing some stationery for all the kids of Betesda Home and Senior Rotarians had also brought along some items to be distributed to the kids. Kids loved all the things that we gave to them. Later on, Rotarian Deepti and the Rotractors played some fun-filled games and activities with the kids. When asked about their future aspirations, a few kids expressed to our Senior Rotarian PP JK ONG their interest to work in Singapore once they grow up. The kids showed their talent as individual and group performances. We were impressed with their enthusiasm and talent demonstrated by the kids. Some senior Rotarians had met these kids in one of their visits to the Home few years ago. The kids quickly recognized them and were so elated to meet them again. This shows the bond that the Rotarians had forged with these kids. We also did an inspection of the new premises for the kids.

This was followed by a delicious seafood lunch at Golden Prawn Seafood Restaurant and rest of the day was spent shopping and sightseeing. We returned in the evening ferry. Rotractors have been asked to prepare some form of structured learning and engaging activity for the kids, for example, workshop on Soft Skills and Basic English, or organizing a collection drive for donating old books and toys for the kids of Betesda Home.

It was a truly inspiring and meaningful experience for both the Rotarians and Rotractors. We would like to thank Rotarian TK Chew and Rotarian Raj Kumar for organizing this weekend trip to Betesda Home in Batam, Indonesia.


