### **Brexit Consequences**

Previous guest Dr Binoy Kampmark was again a fascinating speaker on Monday night, talking about the consequences of Brexit. His main thesis was that, despite both sides of the debate predicting dire outcomes as a result of the vote, the real effects are not yet known.

Binoy indicated that, while there were many recognised positive aspects of the European project, the individual nation states and their peoples were rediscovering the importance of sovereignty. Brexit revealed, in a true global sense, the tensions between the distant unelected officials in Brussels and the British voter. That European project had various virtues but at some point it became gargantuan, marred by bureaucratic insensibility. Binoy noted the return of certain unsavoury elements in European politics. He speculated that Theresa May's appointment of Boris Johnson as Foreign Secretary may have been devised as a form of exquisite punishment for him and indicated his belief that the Germans were looking to deal with long-term demographics problems in inviting Syrian refugees to settle.

The other issue that Binoy mentioned was the pressure exerted by people outside the UK on how British voters should vote. This was most dramatically demonstrated by the needless pressure exerted by President Barack Obama when he stated that a Brexiting state would go to the "back of the queue" on negotiating trade deals. Such statements appear to have been counter productive. The questions and answers were many and varied and a very stimulating evening was had by all.

## The Next Speakers - "Youth Suicide Awareness"

In Australia adolescents are the only group in the community whose health has not improved over the last three decades. Suicide is the largest single cause of all deaths, and represents 22.1% of deaths between the ages of 15 and 24, Sadly for each reported death by suicide there are more than 20 suicide attempts in this age group.

The Youth Suicide Awareness Program was instigated by Brighton North Rotary in 1996, and championed by Brighton North member Phil Wheatley. Since then it has become a District Endorsed Program with over 140 scholarships awarded throughout the District with a total investment by 35 Clubs of in excess of \$500,000 to recipients in many vocations, to arm them with enhanced capabilities to deal with the issue of Youth Suicide, through the Graduate Diploma in Adolescent Health and Welfare from the University of Melbourne.

The speakers are Brighton North Rotarian, Richard Potter and Janine Stratford, the new chair of the Youth Suicide Awareness Committee.
