The Next Speaker - Russell Board

Russell Board has recently retired as Chairman of GHD and has written a book on the history of the company. Russell's talk is entitled 'The Story of GHD, a Global Engineering Consultancy'.

GHD was founded in 1928 as a private consulting engineering practice in Melbourne by A Gordon Gutteridge with a focus on water and sewerage. The NSW based partnership of Gerald Haskins and Geoffrey Davey joined with Gutteridge's practice in 1939 to establish the partnership of Gutteridge, Haskins & Davey.

GHD now employs over 8500 people in over 200 offices throughout Asia, Australia, Europe, North and South America – and the Pacific region. They provide engineering, architecture, environmental and construction services to private and public sector clients.

Some of GHD's success is due to the company's model of employee ownership. The company is owned by people who are employees of GHD and so are custodians of value who build up the business and then pass it on to the next generation who are also GHD employees.
