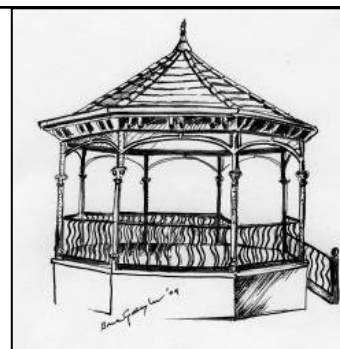

“Ensuring a more reliable and affordable energy future.”

Canterbury Rotary was pleased to welcome the Hon Josh Frydenberg MHR, Member for Kooyong, Minister for Environment & Energy, and Honorary Member of Canterbury Rotary, as Guest Speaker at our dinner meeting on 4 June 2018. Josh has been the MHR for Kooyong since August 2010, and a Cabinet Member in the Turnbull Government since September 2015 as Minister for Environment & Energy since July 2016, and Minister for Resources, Energy and Northern Australia prior to that.



Josh Frydenberg

Josh holds one of the most challenging portfolios in the Turnbull Government, a portfolio which for the first time combines environment and energy, and is often described as a “poisoned chalice” in these days of soaring energy prices and declining reliability of our electricity system. Josh’s presentation was entitled “Ensuring a more reliable and affordable energy future”.

The Turnbull Government has proposed the adoption of its National Energy Guarantee (NEG) policy which sets out to guarantee both CO2 emission reductions over time and electricity availability and reliability, supposedly at least cost. This policy, with further details to be spelled out, is proposed by the Government to be adopted at a meeting of COAG Energy Ministers (from the Federal and State governments) in August 2018.

Josh described the Government’s NEG policy as one which levels the playing field for all forms of electricity generating sources, coal, gas, wind, solar, batteries and pumped hydro storage, allowing them all to compete to provide the cheapest and most reliable sources of reliable low emissions power. He also indicated the need for coal powered electricity base load generation however, the Government does not have the funds to build such a plant. Alternatively, private industry will need to build

base load generation plants but up until the NEG policy is adopted it will be unlikely that private industry will do so due to the uncertainties of a national energy policy.

During a Q&A session, Josh fielded many questions on both energy and the environment. Many questions related to the Paris Accord, the RET Scheme, dispatch rules, Snowy 2.0 pumped energy and the need for Australia to take advantage of its vast energy reserves of coal and gas.

All present very much appreciated hearing from Josh on this important subject.

The FORaMEAL Disaster Relief

Canterbury Rotary's medical mission work in the Philippines has highlighted the continuing need for Disaster Aid in those countries that are regularly devastated by powerful typhoons, earthquakes, uprisings and other disasters. During such disasters there is a need for immediate food relief which can only be met by stores of food kept nearby. The Rotary Club of Canterbury has an ongoing project whereby 50 volunteers can pack 15,000 emergency meals in two hours. These food packs are then sent overseas to places where we have local contacts through Rotary. The food packs are used by emptying the contents into hot water to create a nutritious meal. Often this will be the only nutritious food immediately available for displaced families.



The food packs are prepared by Rotarians along with volunteers - people who would gladly give up two hours and feel completely rewarded for participating in Canterbury Rotary's hands-on project.
