

## Susie Cole ... 'Rotary on the Road'

At this week's meeting, we were fortunate to secure the amazing Rotary Resource of Susie Cole, giving her inaugural 'Rotary on the Road' talk, before she embarks on a roadshow across District 9800. Friend with benefits for me as speaker co-ordinator!

Susie explained that her presentation would really be a talk with Austin, our newest potential member present, with the rest of us eavesdropping, as she shared how Rotary enables her to fulfil her passion for service above self in the most effective way, making great friends across the world and undertaking great adventures with lots of fun thrown into the pot.

Susie started by talking Austin through the Rotary International Conference in Toronto in June , where registration felt like being at The Olympic Games - joining 24,000 delegates! The old idiom "of all the gin joints" played true too, as Susie was fascinated to learn about RAGs and in particular ESRAG (Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group) from Pat who was another Australian from Doncaster Rotary.

Susie then revealed that there are many Rotary Fellowships where ideas can be shared and actions undertaken, utilising the global insight and talents of Rotarians. Curiously, she suggested that the Rotarian Wine Appreciation Fellowship would be right up my alley, (my partner has been a Yarra Valley vigneron). Susie clearly had a ball in Toronto, and encouraged us to join her at Hamburg in 2019.

After about a week at home, Susie went to India to open an Operation Toilet set of stalls. This ongoing Rotary project was initiated by Mark Balla of Box Hill Central Rotary and has now provided toilets for more than 40,000 school children - click the Operation Toilet link to find out more and listen to Mark's TED talk. Susie's Club, Rotary Prahran, was in the can very early, helping to keep girls at school after puberty by providing the missing toilets. It's a joint initiative with Rotary Clubs in India and they hope to flush out facilities for 100,000 students. Provision of school toilets is combined with hygiene education and encouragement to build toilets at home.

Susie then trekked (by plane) to Nepal to see Stephanie Woollard's <u>Seven Women</u> project. This is a sustainable Small Business Enterprise for disabled women who would otherwise remain destitute, due to local cultural discrimination. Susie was fulsome in her praise for Stephanie's work. We will have the opportunity to hear <u>Stephanie Woollard herself on Wednesday 14th November at a multi-club meeting at the Basscare Centre</u> arranged by Camberwell Rotary.

Susie enlighten us with powerful personal insights into the amazing impact Rotary is able to have on people everywhere - both on the recipients and on every participant. Susie is so dynamic in one tall, slim blond capsule! If you weren't present you missed out on a very special talk.

### **Gerry and Kate Cross in Canada**

Our speaker Susie Cole spoke of the global reach and fellowship of Rotarians. This was demonstrated on the recent trip to Canada by Gerry and Kate Cross who met Rod Wiebe, the President of the Powell River Sunrise Rotary Club. Rod is also the OIC of the Powell River Royal Canadian Mounted Police. The Rotary Club is very active and meets for breakfast at the Powell River Town Centre Hotel. While at the Powell River, Gerry met District 5040 DG Darcy Long and David Long. Gerry was presented with a Rotary Club Banner as a token of the meeting.

Powell River is a paper mill town and used to have the world's largest newsprint mill producing 600,000 tonnes of newsprint a year and exporting down to Los Angeles in barges. All the logs came into the mill by water transport and there was a booming ground enclosed with a chain of Liberty ships from WWII. The mill is now supplied with chips transported in scows so the booming area is not needed. The Liberty ships are being cleaned up and then they are to be sunk as artificial reefs to provide dive sites for Scuba Divers. The town is endeavouring to remake itself as a tourist town, as well as a continuing mill town.

## The Next Speaker - Jenelle Fuller

Jenelle Fuller graduated from the Victoria Police Academy in 1988, dux of a double squad of 60 and one of only four women.

Jenelle has worked across many areas of Victoria Police, including Operational roles in Western Suburbs and Sexual Offences and child abuse units, various training roles for public sector workers in remote Aboriginal communities and East Timor. Jenelle was promoted to Sergeant in 2009 and senior Sergeant in 2013 in a strategic role developing and overseeing programs to improve policing outcomes for priority communities and later Officer in Charge of Melbourne West, Victoria's largest police station of over 150 staff. In 2017 she was promoted to Inspector to the Assistant Commissioner of Crime Command, the first female and the first non-detective in the role.
