FORaMEAL Food Packets

We had Doug Hawley provide updated information about the distribution of the FORaMEAL food packages in Marawi City, a city in southern Philippines island of Mindanao where thousands of people have been displaced through IS linked activities. Doug made direct contact with clubs in Manila and organised much needed food packages to be distributed to areas that would not normally be accessible due to rebel activities. Due to some technical issues Doug was unable to show us the photos of the packing and food packet distribution at the meeting, but he will do this presentation at the meeting on Monday.
