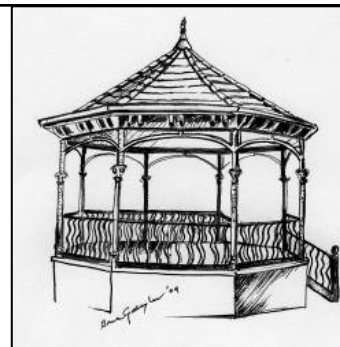

## Visit by District Governor Bronwyn Stephens

Last Monday we had our visit from District Governor Bronwyn Stephens, always a highlight on our club program calendar. This was one of the very best DG visits we have had and it was as if Bronwyn had specifically prepared and customized her message for the style of our club ... informative, interesting, entertaining and relaxed without formality. The added bonus of course is that her husband Mark was able to add great value and additional info on the Multi District Conference. Both Bronwyn and Mark are very strong supporters of Canterbury and you can see they feel very much at home with our club and our style. It was a very good evening.

Bronwyn very modestly described her DG role as that of a “coordinator”. She acknowledged the District involvements of Rosemary, Gerry, Doug and others. She stated that “Rotary for me allows a person to take an idea and develop it to help another person, a community or the whole world”. She talked passionately about her own involvements as a Rotarian, particularly the Rotary programs in Cambodia and the progression to creating a self sustaining rural community with sanitation and literacy for children.

Then, in true Oprah Winfrey style, Bronwyn did roving mike interviews on a few of our club programs, particularly with Doug on the Philippines and the FORaMEAL Program which is proving so successful. There was even a brief discussion about our Beekeeping initiative which is buzzing along as a growing future club program. Doug advised the team leaving this week is the largest yet with 26 including the 50th La Trobe University orthoptic students ... talked about support from Rotary Foundation and RAWKS, with the tax deductibility assistance. There is going to be a FORaMEAL production line at the Multi District

Conference in March ... another great initiative led and organized by our club with the strong assistance and support of other clubs in the District.

We were then shown a very moving video about the work of the (Bone Marrow Donation Institute) BMDI Rotary House which provides accommodation for families of children receiving bone marrow donations, and which now needs funding to upgrade and improve this wonderful Rotary facility for children with cancer. Jars were provided for members to take and fill with gold coins until full as a donation to this very worthy cause.
