OUR CLUB

The Rotary Club of Tortola was established on 5th January 1968 with 20 members. Currently, it is the oldest and largest Rotary Club in the British Virgin Islands with approximately 100 members.

The Club is a member of Rotary International, a worldwide organization of business and professional leaders that provides humanitarian service, encourages high ethical standards in all vocations, and helps build goodwill and peace in the world.

The motto of the Rotary Club of Tortola, and Rotary International, is "Service Above Self" and this is at the very heart of our mission. The Club has been a leader in community projects locally and abroad including building playgrounds and rebuilding schools, running reading projects, funding health service initiatives and providing humanitarian assistance to disaster victims, the less fortunate and other organizations. Our projects do not only benefit those that we serve, but also bring members closer in fellowship. We mix service with fun, fellowship and opportunities for networking, not just at our weekly lunch meetings but at a number of social events throughout the year. Our roster includes individuals from virtually every type of business in the British Virgin Islands.

COMMITMENT

As is always the case, an individual's reward and satisfaction is contingent upon how much he or she commits to it. The Rotary Club of Tortola meets once per week, and each meeting often includes a guest speaker and programme.

We encourage 100% attendance. Missed meetings can be easily made up by attending other Rotary projects, meetings and functions locally and abroad or online at one of the Rotary e-clubs. Each member is also required to pay annual dues and any other annual contributions as required. Additional donations are also encouraged to the Rotary International's Foundation and PolioPlus.



WHY ROTARY?

Rotary International is an organization of some 1.2 million business and professional men and women that provides humanitarian service and helps further international goodwill and peace. There is a worldwide network of more than 34,000 Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries.

The organization started with the vision of one man—Paul P. Harris. The Chicago attorney formed one of the world's first service organizations, the Rotary Club of Chicago, on 23 February 1905 as a place where professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships. Rotary's name came from the group's early practice of rotating meetings among the offices of each member.

Rotary International is on the verge of eradicating a human disease for only the second time in history, after small pox, with a 99 percent reduction in polio cases worldwide since 1985, when Rotary launched its PolioPlus program. In 1988, Rotary spearheaded the creation of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative with its partners the World Health Organization. UNICEF and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Polio eradication remains Rotary's top priority. To date, Rotary has contributed more than US\$1.2 billion and countless volunteer hours to help immunize more than two billion children against polio in 122 countries. Currently, Rotary is working to raise \$35 million per year through 2018 for polio eradication, which will be matched 2 to 1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.






