The Rotary Club of Grand Cayman received its charter on January 28th, 1966, having been sponsored by the Rotary Club of Boston, the seventh oldest club.

The club is part of District 7020, which now encompasses 84 clubs and is part of Zone 34. The Club has sponsored the Rotary Club of Cayman Brac, Grand Cayman Central and the Sunrise Club and has provided 4 District Governors. Major projects have included the construction of the Bonaventure Boys Home and the Frances Bodden Girls Home whilst major annual events organised by the club include the Rotary Auction, the Mardi Gras Tournament, Senior Citizens Party and the Christmas Tree Lighting. In addition, the Club has provided fetal monitors and kidney dialysis machines, a learning booth and 2 mobile dental units. Other projects undertaken by the Club have been the Meals on Wheels programme, painting the Pines retirement home; donating an incubator to the hospital; raising funds for the RI PolioPlus Programme and sponsoring many programs on island including CCMI education programs. The club prides itself on its international work including an annual trip to Guatemala supporting the literacy program. In all, the Club has raised and donated almost three million dollars.

The Club's International and District achievements have included its contribution to the Rotary Foundation, as evidenced by this Club having the largest number of Paul HarrisFellows of any club in the 7020 District and the many District awards and citations which the Club has been presented with over the years.

With over 100 members, the membership of the Club is a fair representation of the business community in Cayman with members ranging in age from their 20's to their 80's.
