
#### **OUR FOUNDATION, OUR CHARITY, "The Rotary Foundation"**

# A Great Combination Rotary - Polio - Taliban.... all I can say is wow!

There are just three areas of the world where poliovirus is present. One of them is on the border between Afghanistan and Pakistan where Rotary is dealing directly with the Taliban to help eradicate the disease.

The President of Rotary International Shekhar Mehta has saluted the efforts of a Rotary member who persuaded the Taliban to lay down their arms to allow for polio immunisation of young children in Pakistan.

Aziz Memon decided he was tired of what was going on in his country. Aziz said the Taliban were causing this problem and he wanted to meet them. The Taliban came and got him, put a hood over his head, put him in a car and took him away. This was a Rotary member who never knew if he would see his family again. They took him to a house, put him in a room and they started asking him questions. The leader wanted to know who he was, why did he want to meet us. He explained what Rotary is – we are non-political, non-religious, we just want to save your children. 


Lids4Kids is a nationwide 100% volunteer project to rescue plastic bottle tops from landfill for the benefit of us all but especially the kids and their future.


