As I look back on this year there have been many changes and challenges for us as a club. We have weathered the storm and together we have been able to show once again that we are the little club that can. We have taken on challenges and risen to the occasion each time.

- Financial support to the Polio Plus Program for the Bill Gates End Polio Now Challenge.

Administration

With the resignation of John Faulkner as treasurer the Board had the task of finding a replacement. We are grateful to John Spiteri for accepting this role and for his time and effort in ensuring that receipts are banked and payments made to our creditors. The Board at the same time to assist John decided that we required a bookkeeper to establish and maintain a chart of accounts. We are grateful for the assistance by PDG Chris Sims in this regard.

The Board in the latter part of 2010 was faced with the task of finding a new meeting venue after the closure of Kirrewur Court. After contacting various function centres the Board decided that we would meet at our present venue, the Queens Park Golf Club and we thank Angie and her team for making us welcome.

Our District Governor Jessie Harman encouraged us to use the Club Runner Program and we are continuing to discover new possibilities for its use. The club developed a new website using Club Runner and Kate Lymer was appointed as our webmaster and has encouaged all members to use the web-site and the Club Runner program. I think the club could expand its use of the program for communication to club members and club executive.

Philip Quick became our Property, Protection and Public Officer. Thank you Phil for taking on these important tasks.

Membership & Public Relations

We began the year with a challenge of increasing the membership to 30 members. Our membership & Public Relations committee under the leadership of Simon Empson have been able to achieve this through an amazing effort in recruiting 6 new members and implementing a club retention program. Unfortunately due to resignations received during the year our membership now stands at 28 members.

It was with deep regret that we accepted resignations from Erica Stastinovsky, Eric Patterson, John and Sharon Faulkner. We were saddened by the death of Mavis Patterson who together with Eric had been assisted with the hosting of Youth Exchange students and assisted with club events, and Marjorie Smith a well loved and tireless worker not only for our club but also the wider community.

We are extremely grateful to Patricia Slack for her excellent effort in promoting the efforts of our club in the Geelong Advertiser and the District newsletter. We were able to have articles on the Ken Wilks Award, Shine On Awards published.

A major boost to our Public Relations was to have time on the radio on Pulse 94.7. Patricia was able to speak about the Shine On Awards and the Sweethearts fundraisers and our Inbound Youth Exchange Student Frederik along with Mark Furlan were able speak about the Youth Exchange Program.

Fellowship & Fundraising

The Fellowship & Fundraising committee under the leadership of John Virgona have been able to ensure that the club has sufficient funds to continue with current programs and implement new programs. Our BBQ trailer has been a great asset to the club and earlier in the year we were successful in obtaining a local government grant to update and add new features to the trailer. We are grateful for Brian Burch to ensure that the trailer is fully stocked and with supplies and equipment. The trailer came in very useful at the City of Greater Geelong Family Christmas Party, as well as the Auskick BBQ, the Blokes Day out events and the week of the UCI World Cycling Championships. We also held sausage sizzles at Bunnings Corio and Waurn Ponds which proved to be great fundraisers. Above all this committee was able to show us that even though it can often be hard work, we can fun and great fellowship at the same time whilst raising funds.

Community Service

Service to the community has been a major focus for Bayside and this year was no different under the leadership of Peter Hynes. We began the year joining with other Rotary Clubs in Geelong for a major fundraiser with Gabriel Gate as special guest for the Christ Church Community Meals Program. It was a great night and raised over \$25000. The Club has continued through the year to assist with the Christ Church Community Meals program and PP John Spiteri took on the role of co-ordinating the Wednesday meal with food and roster. The District saw our efforts as worth of the Aitken Award Publicity and Media by the District Awards Committee for our participation in the combined Rotary Clubs of Geelong Fundraising Dinner for the Christ Church Community Meals Program in Geelong.

We were able to provide another literacy trolley for the Oberon Primary School and an ipod to assist with students at the Oberon High School. It is hoped that we can make up literacy trolleys in kit form that can be purchased by other Rotary Clubs for schools in their area. This is still in the pipeline. We also gave donations to various secondary schools in the region to be given as end of year student awards for the most improvement in English and literacy.

All the club members were affected by the damage done to townships both in Qld and Victoria and so we held a special fundraising event with the Sweethearts. The proceeds from this event and the Pako Festa and the annual sporting event held with the Rotary Club of Torquay totalled \$10000. We were able to donate \$8000 to the Rural Support Committee for the assistance of those affected by the Victorian floods and \$2000 to the Rotary district affected by the floods in Qld.

New Generations

The New Generations Committee under the leadership of Judy Beasley has also been working hard this year. Programs such as Youth Exchange both inbound and outbound continue to be fully supported by the Club members. We welcomed Frederik from Denmark in July who we joint hosted with the RC of Geelong East and we will miss him when he returns home in July. Our outbound exchange student Miriam Petros to Germany was farewelled by the club in January and we enjoy hearing news of her exchange. At the same time we welcomed Riley Hatton back to our club after a very successful exchange in Canada. We were thrilled to hear that Ainsley was successful as our outbound youth exchange student in 2012 to Germany and we wish her all the best as she prepares for her exchange. We look forward to welcoming Frances from Canada in July also being jointly hosted by the RC of Geelong East.

The committee was successful in finding Sarah Kenworthy as applicant for RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program for Enrichment) and Allan Day for the RYLA (Rotary Youth

Leadership Award). Jessie Ann Kenworthy was our applicant for the National Youth Science Forum.

Vocational Service

Our Vocational Service Committee under the leadership of Jo White has again shone for our club. The Ken Wilks Award was again successful this time being held as an afternoon rather than an evening event. This created a friendlier and laid back atmosphere for all those who attended.

A major event for our club was the hosting and hospitality for the Victorian Southern District Shine On Awards. We were humbled to hear how people had overcome their disability in extraordinary ways and made a difference in their workplace, family life and community. Our Club was looked upon with great respect and amazement by all who attended including the District Shine On Awards Committee for hosting a fantastic event.

The Careers Expo held in June each year continues to be supported our Club both financially and with volunteer assistance. Ross Dow attends regularly meetings and keeps the club and the committee informed of the program.

Foundation

Our focus has not only been on local service but also overseas under the leadership of Robin Hunt. The club has continued to support the Bill Gates End Polio Challenge and attended a film night featuring the film "Conviction" at Readings cinema. We also held a Chefs Toolbox fundraiser at the Queens Park Golf Club and were able to raised \$689 also towards Polio Plus.

The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International awarded the Club for per capita contributions in 2009 – 2010. We were recognised as having the third highest contribution in District 9780. We were awarded a certificate and also a framed award from District 9780 Awards Committee.

We began a project for a Matching Grant with the Rotary Club of Kota, India to provide a bus for a school in India. This is still a viable project that the club may pursue in the future.

A fun event in the form of a Hat Day was held in May to raise funds for the Rotary Mental Health Foundation. We were able to raise over \$250 and have fun doing so wearing funny hats.

After a visit from Amanda Hough with a presentation on the work of Interplast, the Club decided to donate \$1000 to assist the work that is done by the surgeons in developing countries to bring dignity and assistance to those who that we suffer from facial disfigurement.

Telsa Stubna has done an outstanding effort as our Sergeant At Arms. Her fine sessions have encouraged members to give their loose change to Foundation programs and it has been great that we have been able to celebrate the birthday and rotary anniversary of our members.

A special thank you to Secretary Jan for her effort in keeping us up to date with District Activities and the preparation of agendas and posting of minutes for our monthly Board meetings Her attention to detail is appreciated.

To John Spiteri as our Treasurer, for taking over the task after the resignation of John Faulkner. Thank you for keeping ensuring that our bills were paid in a timely manner and our receipts were banked and recorded.

We are grateful to PDG Chris Sims who took over the role for our Club as our Bookkeeper. He created a chart of accounts for all our receipts and expenditures and prepared the financial statements for our monthly Board meetings

Our program and roster officer Harlan has done an outstanding job in ensuring that we have an interesting speaker each night and this has been evidenced by the amount of questions that have been asked of the speakers.

Thanks to Dan Furlan for his preparation and distribution of the Bollard ensuring that is ready each week with interesting summary of the weekly meetings with photos and other articles.

With all these programs we have been able through our service to build communities locally and in our district and we have been able to bridge continents not only through our giving to the Foundation but through our promotion and participation in Youth Exchange.

Our participation with **bigger**, **better** and **bolder** ideas and programs we can make a bigger difference and show that we are the little club that can!

Matching Grant

Bus Project for Shikar Special School, Kota, India total cost of US\$ 26,700 Indian club contribution including TRF & DDF contributions – US\$ 14,500

Our club contribution - \$5,000
TRF contribution - \$2,500
DDF application - \$2,500
TRF 1:1 contribution against DDF \$2,500
Total \$12,500

Although, in principle, this is a viable project for a matching grant, due to changes in the system it will have to be assessed in next year's programme to ensure it complies with the new guidelines.

Centurion Program:

This program is used in this District as a method of supporting the Annual Program Fund, and has been well canvassed within the district. Through the principle of Every Rotarian Every Year, its operation involves \$100.00 per head per annum. It also supports the Sustaining Member Program that is achieved by a contribution of US \$100.00 per head per annum. Centurion contributions can be directed to Polio Plus, with all avenues accruing credits for PHF recognition.

A total of \$ 1,906 has been contributed this year including contributions from 2010 and 2011.

Foundation Fundraising

So as not to burden members with costs additional to normal meeting nights (as there are many fundraising projects placing demands on members) we are holding a fundraiser on a normal meeting nights, at a normal meeting cost, and either providing our own supper or having the supper provided at minimal cost. Angie (Queens Park Golf Club) has provided the venue at no cost, so long as she can keep the proceeds of bar sales.

 Chef's Toolbox cooking demonstration including promotion of their products was held on 31 May 2011 raising \$ 689.

Polio Plus

A total of \$2000 will be paid to Polio Plus, which the Bill Gates Foundation will match dollar for dollar.

UPDATE - MAY 2011 Eddie Loughnan Chairman - District 9780 Polio Plus Committee

The struggle continues to eliminate those last traces of this dreaded disease from the face of our earth and every day brings new successes and new challenges. It would be possible, after looking at the raw statistics, to imagine the situation is worsening but in reality, huge advances are being made in key areas and great optimism exists in others.

Spectacular progress has been made in three of the four remaining polio endemic countries. India (1) Nigeria (8) and Afghanistan (1) have reported just 10 cases between

them to the end of April.

Uganda, the Russian Federation, Liberia, Nepal, Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, Senegal, Mauritania and Sierra Leone are all clear after minor imported outbreaks last year. Tajikistan, where 458 cases were reported last year, is also clear with the last case being reported in July 2010.

Problems still exist in Pakistan, the remaining polio endemic country, although with 33

cases to the end of April, the position is being well managed.

Africa continues to give some cause for concern. Chad and the Democratic Republic of the Congo being the main trouble spots with 76 cases between the two of them but Governments in both countries are firmly committed to urgently attacking the problem. The Congo reported 384 cases last year but only one so far this year so the signs are also good in that country.

It's interesting to note that of the 120 cases reported to April 27th, 111 are Type 1 and

only 9 are Type 3. At this time last year the cases were 50/50.

So let's not slow down now. We are much too close to victory for that! So what can Rotary Clubs and members do to maintain the impetus?

Primarily – honour our commitment to raise US\$200m to meet the Challenge of the Gates Foundation. We have 14 months to 30 June, 2012 left to complete the Challenge and have so far raised about US\$168 Million.

With virtual parity between the Australian and American Dollar, there has never been a better time for Rotarians to send donations as Centurions/Sustaining Members as well as their clubs to Parramatta endorsed "The Australian Rotary Foundation Trust – PolioPlus."

Donations identified as such are tax deductible for members and provide Paul Harris Credits for both clubs and individuals.
