

This week we hear from Daryll Webb PP. PHF

I have always wanted to help people by listening to their stories. My training began back in 1990 with studies in pastoral care at a theological college with a Bachelor of Theology degree being accredited in 2000.

This training was the springboard to joining Victorian Council of Churches Emergency Ministries as a volunteer support worker in 2015. In this role I can be called out to assist a relief centre or assist in outreach in visiting homes in the vicinity in times of fire or other emergencies. One of the biggest challenges was being involved with a team of



volunteers during the Bourke Street Tragedy in Melbourne. Allowing people to tell their stories and how the incident had affected them and helping them in their path to recovery. In 2017 I was appointed as a joint area-coordinator for Geelong and Queenscliff. I am also on the City of Geelong and Queenscliff Shire Municipal Emergency Management Planning Committee and am now the Deputy Chairman of the Municipal Recovery Sub- Committee of COGG.

Last year I was approached by the Operations Manager of VCCEM to put in an application to be a Volunteer Chaplain with Ambulance Victoria. My application was approved, and a letter of offer was emailed by Ambulance Victoria which was accepted in Feb 2021. Name badges and uniform were organized and finally the ID badge and we were attended two special training sessions on Zoom. In July this year my details were forwarded to the regional chaplain who took me around to the Ambulance stations that I would be visiting. I have been assigned to the Belmont, Torquay, Leopold, and the team at Geelong Fleet Services who service all the ambulances for the region. In this role I visit the stations and talk to the paramedics with the aim of forming a relationship with the members of the stations. I am expected to put in four hours a week in this role, but I can see myself doing more than this.

I wear the uniform with pride and hope as relationships are formed with the paramedics and they feel comfortable to share their stories with me. I know my dad would be proud of me. Dad had served as an industrial chaplain before he retired. Di said I was like a child getting ready for the first day of school.
