

THE GRID POWERING THE FUTURE

From our guest speaker Nij

We do have choices

Energy scientist Dr Niraj Lal travels across the country to see what work is being done to harness green energy, to power our future reliably — and keep Australia's lights on. Our continent is rich in renewable resources. We're bathed in sun, have plenty of wind and there's no shortage of waves, yet 75% of our electricity is still produced by burning coal and gas. More than a third of our greenhouse gas emissions come from electricity, and it's having a devastating impact on our climate.

But right now, we're in the middle of an energy revolution. As renewables grow rapidly the grid is evolving, bringing new challenges and opportunities. Nij visits a power station north of Adelaide to see how gas turbines derived from

aircraft are supporting renewable technologies as they enter the grid. In remote South Australia, Nij climbs over 90 metres to the top of a wind turbine and learns how it can contribute to the grid even when the wind isn't blowing, thanks to Australia's largest battery. These pesky little pieces of plastic attached to your fresh bread isn't trash. They are potential life givers to people like *Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs*, who collect them, sell them to recyclers and turn the cash into wheelchairs for people who can't afford them.

It takes around 200kg of plastic ties to fund a wheelchair (at around 1 gram

each, I assume that's 200,000 of them).

Member Rick Berry and wife Jan collect these magic little pieces of plastic that turn into wheelchair for their grandchildren's school. What a fabulous thing for children to be involved with.

Do you buy bread and what do you do with the tag? can I suggest you collect them and bring to the meeting when we can to add to Rick & Jan's collection. I have started with my first one today. Also sent out to all my family and friend and they are collecting them as well. People Power!






I asked last week if any of our members were volunteering in a different organisation and if you could share what you are involved in.
