# Your Chance to Get your Local Community Project Proposal Funded

he Commonwealth Government has announced a sixth round of

funding for local projects under the Stronger Communities

Programme. Up to \$150,000 of funding is available in the
electorate of Corio for small capital projects which improve
community participation and contribute to the vibrancy and viability
of local communities.

Grants of between \$2,500 and \$20,000 will be available, but unlike previous rounds, unless you are a Local Governing Body, funding is available for up to 100 per cent of eligible project costs — meaning that your organisation does not need to contribute to the project costs.



### Polio Project at Geelong East Primary School



For many years Geelong East Primary School students have participated in the Rotary Junior Community Award (RJCA) program. In this year of COVID-19, students found it

impossible to conduct a hands-on community project and instead undertook to research polio and Rotary International's effort to eradicate the disease.

This initiative arose from a suggestion by Rotarian Gary Newton, a polio survivor, and Vice-President of Polio Australia. On 9th December 2020, Gary was invited to the school to speak to the RJCA students about polio and present a certificate of excellence for the best polio project. To his surprise the teachers had arranged for all Grades 5 and 6 students to hear his story. The students and their teachers were captivated from the start and listened intently as Gary told of contracting polio at the age of 15 months, causing him to be isolated in an infectious disease hospital in Melbourne, with no parents allowed to visit for 32 days. It was awful! He explained that when the polio virus hit the community, schools, swimming pools and other community spaces were locked down, much like the corona virus restrictions today.

Gary didn't attend school until the age of seven and then it was at the Yooralla Hospital School for Crippled Children. He didn't attend a 'normal school' until he was 15 years of age. After finishing school, he found employment in a career he had always wanted: as a radio announcer.

# **OUR PARTNERSHIP** WITH THE BLUEBIRD **FOUNDATION**

he Rotary Club of Geelong East has developed a wonderful relationship with the Bluebird Foundation, a community arts organisation creating and delivering quality arts programs that make a real difference in people's lives. The partnership



began in late 2013 when together we successfully applied for a Community Arts Grant funded by the City of Greater Geelong. The project was the first

in what became known as Athena's Guild. The initial program matched experienced professional visual artists with a disability. In the private studios of the professional artists, the pairs worked together during a series of



mentoring sessions with a minimum requirement being for both mentor and mentee to produce a portrait of their partner. A highly successful exhibition entitled *Pair Shaped* was held at the Karingallery from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> May 2014.

Other versions of *Athena's Guild* followed. In 2015–2016, the *Open House* project matched experienced professional musicians with young people experiencing hardship. Once again the pairs worked together, composing music and songs, culminating in a sold-out public concert at the Courthouse Youth Arts on 25 May 2016. Rotarians helped out at rehearsals,

promoted the event and assisted on the night of the concert in various capacities.

In 2016–2017 professional musicians/songwriters were paired in a mentoring relationship with a youth experiencing homelessness in a project entitled *Life After Park*. Their work was showcased in a sellout concert held at the Courthouse Youth Arts on 31 May 2017. Once again Rotarians helped out where they were needed.

participated in *Pitch Up*, an innovative event hosted by *Give Where You Live*. The Bluebird Foundation was one of three community organisations chosen to argue their case to a packed audience as to why they should receive financial support. Donations made by those present where matched by funding partners of *Give Where You Live*. Representatives from Geelong East Rotary attended and helped raise over \$30,000 for the North Children's Choir, another Bluebird project making a real difference in the lives of children and their families

living in the northern suburbs of Geelong. Our club received a 2020–2021 District 9780 grant to support Bluebird to convert one of their proven art programs from face-to-face to online access.

Propeller Online supports



disadvantaged young people across the City of Greater Geelong to engage with educational creative arts workshops. The students were recruited through a network of social welfare agencies, schools and other community organisations. Online resources and interactive

tools will maintain educational opportunities, social interaction, mentoring and peer relationships throughout the COVID-19 crisis when face-to-face workshops are not possible. We look forward to hearing about the outome of *Propeller Online once* it's been evaluated.

The Rotary Club of Geelong East is proud of the positive difference we are making in people's lives through our ongoing association with the *Bluebird Foundation*.




