Two more meetings and lots of book sorting to go and then hopefully a brad new year where life can be more normal than this year.

A reminder that the AGM will be by zoom on 30th November and the Annual report has been circulated for comment in readiness. We then have managed to organise a Xmas get together face to face on Wednesday 9th December and Kasia will be sending out the invitation. We had to do this on a night different to our usual meeting night as venues are just not open on Mondays and often Tuesday as well. I hope with adequate notification we can get most of our members to attend with their partners. What a great night that will be! On Monday last week the Past Presidents met to discuss two issues. The first was the future leadership of the Club and the formation of future Boards. The lack of new members, the aging of most of our current members and the structure of Rotary in Geelong were discussed. We all agreed that, despite the push from RI and the District to promote membership, new members will not automatically resolve the issues and that Rotary, especially in Geelong, needs to be looked at with new vision and there needs to be leadership from the District to do this. The Past Presidents did not rule out amalgamation of clubs if it meant that Rotary would survive in Geelong. The result of this was that we have written to DG Phil Beasley and our AG, Vici Furnell, and invited them to come and listen to the views of the members. We have asked them to attend on Monday 1 February and Jim, representing the Past Presidents, and myself will meet with them prior to the meeting. The second discussion item was the celebration of 100 years of Rotary in Australia next year in March. The R100 group decided that the event would take the form of a baton relay, now reduced from two days to one, with possibly three batons moving in from Torquay, the Bellarine and Lara, possibly using Harleys from the Ulysses Club. The batons would pass through Geelong and be handed on from Club to Club, with small events at hand over stations culminating in a gathering of Rotarians in Johnson's Park with an address from the Mayor and our AG, and maybe an invitation for organisations helped by Rotary, to attend. The Past Presidents felt that this was going to be a huge effort for possibly small reward, especially so soon after our Book Fair in February. They were also concerned that glorifying Rotary and its achievements without trying to fund raise was not why we joined Rotary and doubted if the event was going to have any impact. As the R100 group need Club buy in by the end of November, I have sent an email to the organisers to let them know that we will not be participating but that we will be advertising the Book Fair as a celebration of 100 years of Rotary and asking Clubs to have their banners and any other information about what they have achieved on display at the event. Take care everyone and I hope to see you on Monday.

Meeting 23/11//2020

We welcomed guest speaker PDG Jane Cox (2015-16) who following her year as Governor was nominated to the Board of Australian Rotary Health.

ARH began in 1981 at the RC Mornington where member Ian Scott proposed an organization t do original research into SIDS. In 2000 the focus moved away from SIDS research, which was becoming well funded and better understood, and onto Mental Health Research to the point where ARH is now the largest research funder behind only the Government.

Jane told us that a major focus is now Young Australians with research into:

- Brain training
- Mood and young people
- School interaction study (bullying).

ARH is not a project of RI rather it is a project of the Rotary Clubs of Australia and financed within Australia by clubs and bequests. You may recall the Hat Day for ARH. This has now morphed into 'Lift the Lid' walk for mental health which is planned for next October (see article in latest RDU p55).

Another area in which ARH is active is in providing Indigenous Health scholarships. The scholarships are given in nursing, health and allied professions and interestingly are not available to first year students. Rather second and later students are eligible as the drop our rate of <u>all</u> university students appears to be high in the first year. This program has now been funded by Government for four years.

Finally Jane mentioned that ARH is linking into the 'Purple House' project in Northern Australia as there is a mental link...
