College tuition is rising at a rate of 7% per year. Be smart when applying for college entrance. Lora gave the following advice:

Major Career – know what field you want to work in – complete a major assessment

College Selection – select a college based on your major field of study Admission Essay – write a compelling essay; include volunteer work and leadership experience

College Application – apply to six colleges

FAFSA CSS Profile – get your financial aid forms in early – October

Negotiating Tuition – for special circumstances

Scholarship / Loans – explore all avenues of assistance – look for low interest rates

Take the ACT/SAT three times ACT/SAT and college application fees can be waived Reposition the child's assets.
