


May 15, 2020

Program

His priorities for the new year include:

His wish list includes: a membership guide for the year, with a timeline for our activities through the year; making us a bit more technically experienced and oriented, using a Club communication app (he intends to use "Slack"); he would like to have our meetings streamed online, so that travelling Club Rotarians can join our meetings, even when they are traveling or snow-birding; he wants to make our website "sexy" so that it not only gets information out, but also looks interesting; he wants a consistent and persistent social media presence for the Club. He would grow our membership +3.

Wes has been working with Bill K with the Taiwanese, and he has noticed that they take Rotary very, very seriously. Wes would like to introduce a bit of that here.

Wes would like a new secondary fundraiser, especially since our current secondary fundraiser is the "vacation raffle" and given current circumstances, a "vacation" prize might not be so attractive. He would like us to come up with something creative, that we care about.

Rotarians had many questions about internet/in-person meetings and technology. Wes noted that streaming the meetings would allow us to spread out to other rooms in Chandler's (to keep our distance). Jack L observed that we could use the technology to bring in international speakers – a fantastic idea. Wes noted that we will need to see what Chandler's can do, and might wish to do, in the post-coronavirus time.

Bill K gave his props to Wes, for his work to put the technology in place for the upcoming meeting with the Taiwanese Rotary Club.
