

Cook County is the second most populated county in the country. The Cook County Forest Preserve was established in 1915 and has over 70,000 acres to date. In what was once covered in prairie and forest, Cook County is now mostly developed with only .5% undeveloped green space. The CCFP maintains and restores a wide range of landscape habitats striving for healthy diversity.
