DISTRICT CONFERENCE PROGRAM

District Governor Lyle Staab started our District Conference lunch at 12:30. He explained what the District Conference has covered as of this date. He then went on to talk about the Foundation Giving. This included information about Global Grants in 2020-2021. He also talked about District 6440.

Julie Clark introduced our speaker: Amanda Ottman. Amanda Ottman's relationship with Rotary began as a Youth Exchange Student to Argentina in 2000. Constantly maintaining an international humanitarian focus, Amanda has worked with non-profits both in MN, Dominican Republic, Spain, and Haiti. In 2011-12, Amanda served as a Rotary World Peace Fellow, completing her Master's studies in International Relations at the Universidad del Salvador in Buenos Aires, Argentina and interning with Save the Children in Spain. She reported that all of her studies in Argentina were in Spanish which provided a unique experience. People from all over

the world attended this course of study.

Amanda currently serves as the President of the District 5950 Rotary Alumni Association and is works as a global connections officer for American Refugee Committee. She has helped expand global grants in Italy, Ethiopia, and other countries.

Questions from the Club:

Jim F. asked if she was still in contact with the organizations she worked with. She said yes, Covid has impacted this a bit, but Peace Fellows can still work on the ground.

Jean S. asked which kind of partners she worked with. She reported that she worked with non-profits, and all types of organizations. Including Girl Scouts, corporate partners, etc.

DG Lyle asked what we do poorly and what should we do to improve. She reported that her experience gives her a different perspective than what others may have. One way to improve is continuing the Peace Fellow program.

Sarah B. asked if she has kept in touch with the people, she worked with in the Refugee Rotaract Clubs. She said no because of the challenges it brings in refugee settlements.

DG Lyle Staab then talked about a new Guatemalan Project. A new school in El Dorado will be receiving help with water needs and other maintenance items.
