Patrick Hampton won the Lucky Buck and donated it to CUHS Drama Club.




SHERIFF DICK:

President's Messages & Announcements:



Presentation: Barbara Burns introduced our speaker, Bruce Badrigian, who spoke about Armenian Genocide. Bruce began by telling us that the first genocide of the 20th Century occurred in the Ottoman Empire, 1915-23. More than 1.5 million of the 2 million Armenians living in the Ottoman Empire at the time

were killed. Nearly every Armenian lost a family member. The genocide was perpetrated by the young Turkish government, the main reason being Turkification. The pretext for the genocide was religious differences, economic differences and scapegoat for Work War I military losses.

Bruce's grandmother was alive during the genocide and lost her first husband, who was killed trying to defend their home. She eventually was able to escape from Armenia with her two small daughters who, like so many Armenian children at the time, starved to death. She,

however, was rescued by a man who was later to become her husband.

Thanks to Bruce for this very interesting, although disturbing history lesson.
