Sue Robinson introduced speaker Dennis Frahmann, who made a presentation highlighting the innovations of October's upcoming Scarecrow Festival. Dennis's background is in journalism and marketing. He has a Master's degree in Journalism from Columbia University and is the author of three books, including his latest Devil's Analyst.

For 2016, the committee has added more prize categories and cash prizes. There was a successful adult workshop and a student workshop is scheduled for July 30. It will include many youth groups such as Boy Scouts, CYAA, etc. The Kick-off event will be enhanced and a VIP Sunset Tour and dinner will be added to the opening weekend.

The Scarecrow Awards Ceremony and a Taste of the Coast event will be held October 1 at the Vet's Hall. Dennis said the Rotary Club could contribute to the project by creating their own entry for the Scarecrow Festival, encourage the Interact Club to participate, and promoting the Festival events as volunteers or attendees.
