- ★ 1913 first Big Brother agency founded in Toronto, ON
- **1964** local agencies were founded in Niagara Falls & South Niagara
- 2013 Big Brothers Big Sisters of Canada celebrated 100 years of mentoring children and youth in Canada

The single most common factor for children who develop resilience is at least one stable and committed relationship with a supportive parent, caregiver, or other adult.

Yet...

1 in 5 youth report having no strong

relationships. (Source: Search Institute)

- 1 in 5 youth do not have access to a committed, caring adult who can buffer the impacts of stress and ignite their potential.
- 1 in 5 youth do not have access to the foundational relationships needed to meet the challenges they will undoubtedly face.





Researchers and health professionals are increasingly warning that all children require nurturing and consistent relationships with adults in order to thrive.

The COVID-19 pandemic has:

- caused increased social isolation
- increased the levels of stress and toxicity in family homes
- challenged the well-being of young people and adults alike


