

WHO ARE YOTO YOUTH?



Most common reasons for homelessness:

- Parents kicked them out (new partner, differing belief systems, youth is LGBTQ+)
- Parents cannot afford to provide shelter, food, and clothing
- Parents struggle with physical or mental illness
- Parental substance abuse
- Parental deportation or incarceration

Most common living situations:

- Couch hopping
- Their own apartment (18+) or share an apartment
- Emergency shelter: Hotel/motel/shelters
- Not meant for long term habitation: Tent/car/outside

1 out of 5 are pregnant or parenting
1 out of 4 identify as LGBTQ+

OUR MISSION

To support the **high school graduation** and **continued success** of youth experiencing **homelessness**.

YOTO provides three things:

- 1. Financial stipend
- 2. All basic needs for free
- 3. Guidance and support



WHY IS YOTO'S WORK IMPORTANT?

- When young people don't graduate, it affects us all
 - Each dropout costs Tucson \$382,900 over their lifetime
 - No diploma, unemployment rate 3.5 times higher
- It's really hard for homeless youth to graduate
 - 64% graduation rate nationally
 - 4.5 times more likely to experience adult homelessness it's a cycle!

• Tucson needs help

- Pima County average graduation rate: 74%
- Arizona has 2nd worst graduation rate in the US
- >2,700 homeless school-aged youth identified in Pima County


