

Several sanctioned avenues for immigration

More than than a million U.S. residents were born in a country that formerly was part of the United Soviet Socialist Republic (USSR). Thirty-five percent were born in Russia, while 32 percent were born in Ukraine, as was Kiev born-and-raised, Alexander Dolitsky of Juneau. As an immigrant, Dolitsky will address various legal immigration avenues.

The social studies instructor and archeologist received an MA in history from Kiev Pedagogi-



He has worked as a U.S. Forest Service archaeologist and social scientist, an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Russian Studies at UAS from 1985 to 1999, as a social studies instructor at the Alyeska Central School, Alaska Department of Education and Yukon-Koyukuk School District from 1988 to 2006, and is the proprietor of the Alaska–Siberia Research Center (based in his Juneau home) which he started 1990.

Dolitsky has conducted 32 field studies in various areas of the former Soviet Union, including Siberia, as well as Central Asia, South America, Eastern Europe and the U.S. He has been a lecturer on smaller cruise vessels in the Arctic and sub-Arctic and was project manager for the WWII Alaska–Siberia Lend Lease Memorial, erected in Fairbanks in 2006. He has published widely in the fields of anthropology, history, archaeology, and ethnography.


