Online financial transactions have invited online fraud, as well. So, guys like Mike Mason are in demand. Mason is head of the Electronic Funds Transfer section at First National Bank, Alaska. He has experience in the coordination,

planning and support of call center operations and an expert on the Automated Clearing House (the electronic network for financial transactions in the U.S.), wires, corporate card expense report management, cyber security, and disaster recovery operations. He is responsible for trainings and for providing technical support and expertise to corporate clients of all sizes. Mason's top tip is to keep private information private and to never share bank account numbers or PINS with anyone – even people you trust.

Philippines projects supported by club KIVA lend

In honor of last week's presenter, Filipino Honorary Consul Rebecca Carrillo, all of the small loans approved as part of a KIVA lend meeting were designated for Philippine projects. Eleven loans, totaling \$1,275 were allocated for agriculture, construction, and the service sector. All but one of the loans went to women. In the past 11 years, the club has made 1,240 loans with a total value of \$110,025 using actual club donations of \$17,792.
