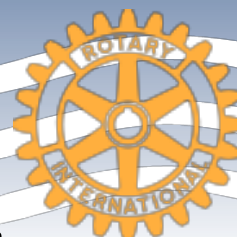

**Alaska's
Corrections
mission needs
greater definition**



Daryl Webster brought a unique background – of law and law enforcement -- to the Lemon Creek Correctional Center (LCCC) when he became assistant superintendent of the maximum-security prison in 2015. And, he brought the idea of strengthening staff through a unique communication initiative.

Webster retired as Deputy Chief of Police in Tulsa, OK, in 2014, after 28 years on the front lines of law enforcement. He also has a law degree from the University of Tulsa, as well as a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from California State University at Fresno.

When Webster arrived at LCCC, he launched a quarterly e-publication, "The Lemon Creek Journal," to "inform, engage, and challenge corrections professionals and the public to think critically about the challenges facing Alaska's correctional system." The articles primarily are written by staff members and focus on strengthening professionalism.

Seventy-three corrections officers, probation officers and support staff work at the facility which is intended for 225 inmates. At any given time, 20-30 percent of the inmates are in pre-trial status; the remainder are male and female sentenced felons.

Webster will talk about the mission of Alaska's Department of Corrections and issues facing LCC, including turnover, recruitment, budget and professionalism.

"The mission of corrections is sort of the question that powers the discussion," says Webster. "It may be retribution, deterrence, incapacitation, rehabilitation or a mix of them all." He says he's interested in hearing from the public as to what the mission should be.
