steward watersheds and support communities through participatory projects, research, and learning. SAWC believes healthy, productive watersheds are the lifeblood of the region's resource-based economy, subsistence lifestyle, and overall quality of life. SAWC works to build community capacity to implement local and collaborative approaches to management, development, and stewardship of the region's watersheds.

John Hudson has been a restoration biologist with SAWC since June 2017. He works closely with the non-profit's executive director and science director to improve the health of streams and their watersheds for

fish, wildlife, and people. He partners with a wide range of individuals, non-profits, and local, state, and federal governments to eradicate invasive plants, manage storm water runoff, restore salmon habitat, and promote watershed stewardship. Prior to joining SAWC, John worked for the Pacific NW Research Station, Alaska Dept. of Fish and Game, National Marine Fisheries Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and as a private consultant. John has lived in Juneau since 1994.

#### Scholarship program builds corps of peacemakers around the world

More than 1,300 men and woman from around the world have been trained in peace building in 115 countries – and District 5010 would like to add to that. **May 31 is the deadline** to apply for a Rotary Peace Fellows scholarship. There are two levels: an average of \$75,000 for a masters (50 each year) or about \$11,000 for those earning a Professional Certificate (80 annually). To qualify for the higher level, applicants must have a BA, three years in related work and be proficient in English. Those seeking the certificate must have five years related work and a vision for change. Rotary Foundation covers most of the costs; sponsoring clubs or districts (District 5010 is a "peace district") help with miscellaneous expenses. The Peace program was launched in 2002 when Rotary partnered with leading universities to create Rotary Peace Centers. **For more info or to apply: www.rotary.org/en/peace-fellowship**
