KIVA lending power doubled through donor match

Candy Behrends, Julie Olson, John Pugh, and Robert Minch last weekend awarded 17 loans, each of \$100 to small-scale manufacturing entrepreneurs in nine countries. The amount of each loan was doubled by an anonymous donor. To date, the club has leveraged \$17,402 in club donations to make almost 1,200 loans in 72 countries totaling just under \$105,000.
