From pandemic prep to adjusting to the new normal

Rose Lawhorne is Chief Nursing Officer at Bartlett Regional Hospital (BRH) and Operations Section Chief for the Covid-19 response. In mid-March, Bartlett began to prepare in earnest for potential COVID-19 surge. With the City and Borough of Juneau (CBJ) Incident

Command Structure (ICS), a Unified Incident Command (UIC) established to guide response efforts. BRH ICS developed and implemented an emergency operations plan (EOP) to respond to the pandemic. The unit assessed facility layout and implemented revisions to space, airflow, and work processes to allow for isolation and care of both non-viral and COVID-19 patients, following a multi-level surge strategy that incorporated a plan for overflow into alternate care sites. Equipment and supplies were evaluated, with additional stock on hand purchased. Personal protective equipment (PPE) was purchased in greater volumes as available through supply chains and special ordering processes. Through an incredible response from community members, masks and gowns were made and distributed. The needs of vulnerable populations were evaluated and addressed. Currently, BRH is resuming normal services and operations, yet remains prepared for a surge of COVID-19 patients. CBJ UIC efforts are focused on community testing and supporting the "new normal".

Lawhorne began her journey at Bartlett in 1993, working in the patient registration and billing departments for six years. In 1999, she moved to Anchorage where she obtained her nursing degree and worked at Alaska Regional Hospital. She returned to Bartlett in 2002, working in Critical Care and the Emergency Department (ED) till she became ED Director in 2010. Over the years, she was given responsibility for additional areas and became Assistant Chief Clinical Officer. Lawhorne holds an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing from University of Alaska, a Bachelor of Science and Master of Science in Nursing from University of Phoenix.
