SHI campus goal: an economic engine
that makes Juneau the capital
of Northwest Coast arts



A new 6,000 square foot indoor and outdoor campus being built by Sealaska Heritage Institute (SHI) in central downtown will house space for artists to make monumental Northwest Coast art pieces (such as totem poles and canoes), classrooms, an art library, and public performance and gathering spaces. The campus is being built in the former Sealaska parking lot; there will be underground parking, instead. The project is providing 55 jobs and is expected to generate \$9.5 million in local expenditures through the construction period. SHI launched construction Aug. 5 after securing funding commitments for 85 percent of the \$13.2 million price tag. The project, expected to be completed in 2021, is coordinated by Dawson Construction and designed by MRV Architects. SHI is a private nonprofit founded in 1980 to perpetuate and enhance Tlingit, Haida and Tsimshian cultures of Southeast Alaska. Its goal is to promote cultural diversity and cross-cultural understanding. SHI also conducts social scientific and public policy research.
