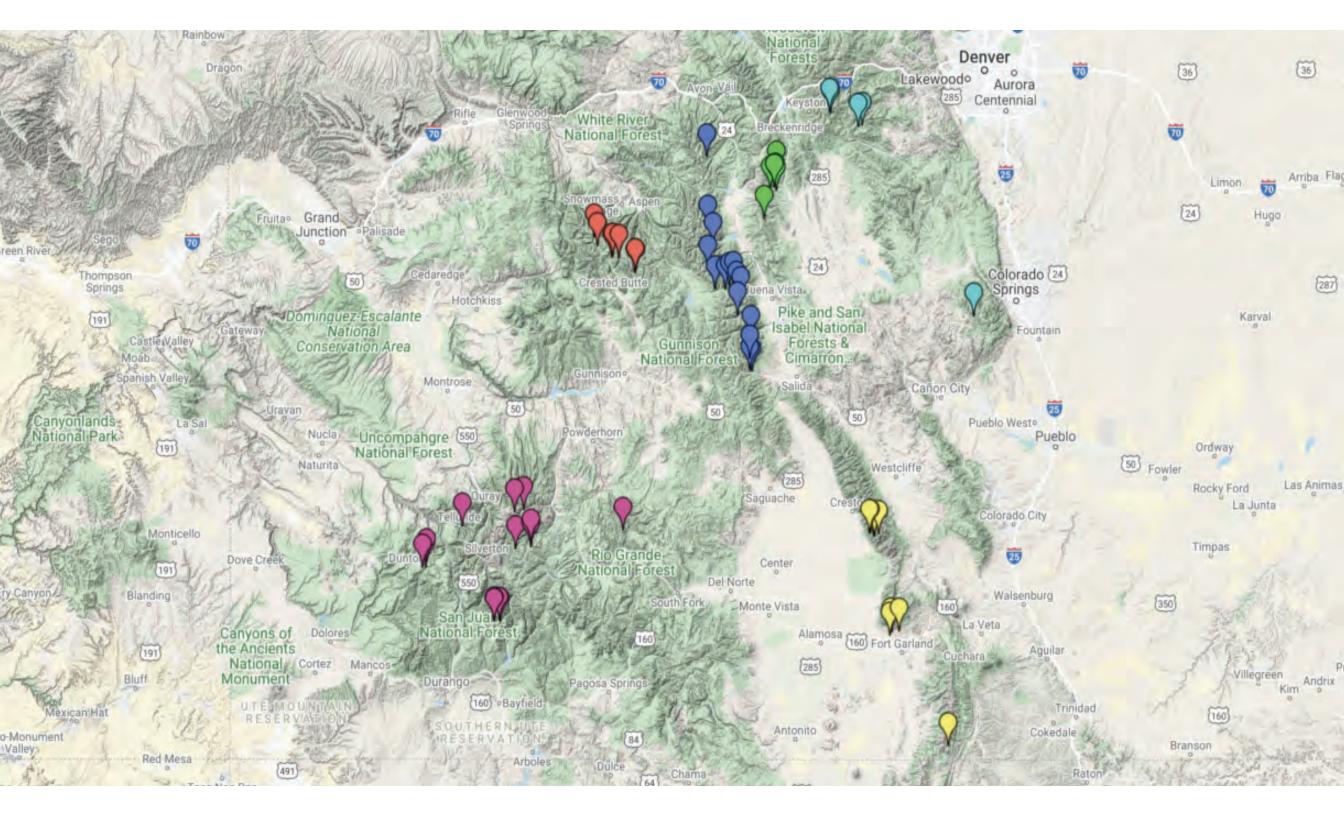

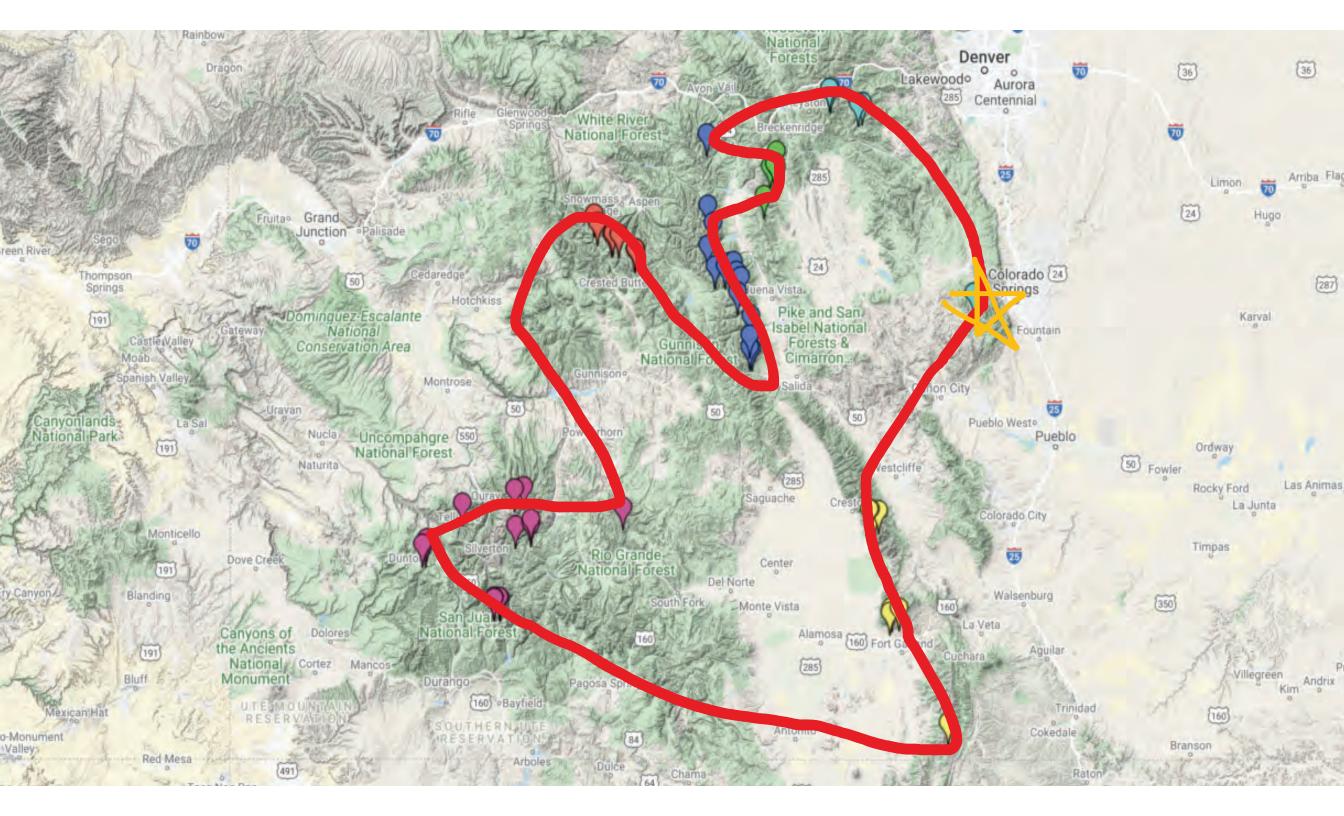

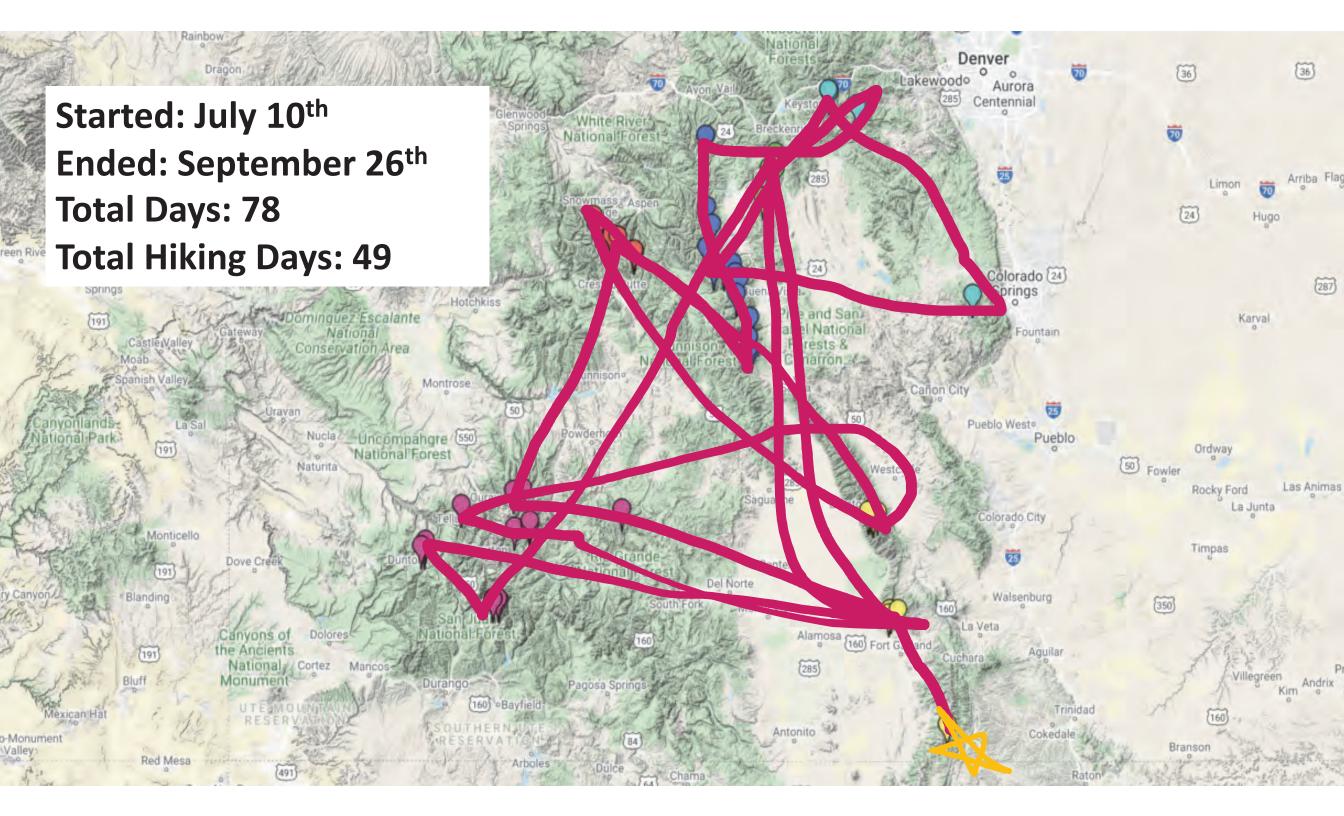

Marmots, pika, coyotes, bear, moose, long horn sheep, mountain goats, martens, cows









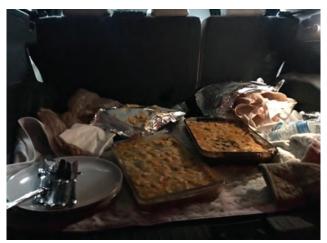
What was the best part of the project?
