#### Find Vaccine Providers








# Case Data: Adams, Arapahoe, and Douglas Counties





#### Epi Curve of Daily Confirmed and Probable COVID-19 Cases



#### Weekly Incidence Rates, per 100,000




# Location of cases: past week




## Case Characteristics

- Ages of cases are shifting. More younger cases, fewer older cases
- Majority of hospitalizations are aged 45+




# Hospitalizations (Date of first admission)

- Hospitalizations are also going down. Currently 24 COVID-related hospitalizations in Douglas County hospitals (150 on 12/1/20).
- Hospitalizations lag behind case reporting



## Deaths

- Deaths also going down. 233 deaths in DougCo. 82% to people 75+
- Deaths lag behind hospitalizations and case reporting



Individuals eligible in phases 1A, 1B.1, and 1B.2 will be prioritized off our waitlist. Plan to bring proof of eligibility to your appointment. Complete our COVID-19 Vaccine form and then you will be directed to make your appointment at one of our clinic locations.






