VOCATIONAL TALK – Jim Schermetzler

Jim was born in 1952 in Manitowoc, Wisconsin which is half way between Green Bay and Milwaukee. It has a harbor on Lake Michigan. Jim's parents were German farmers and children of the Great Depression and carried those effects through their lives. "If you didn't work, you didn't eat". Jim is the second oldest of 10 children. His dad served in the miliary and then worked in a factory. He was fortunate to have parents that put all 10 kids through Catholic education up to Grade 12. In junior high, Jim went to work in a restaurant as a dishwasher. His real aspiration was to become a teacher. He went to school and eventually dropped out and worked at that restaurant for 26.5 years.





He eventually moved to Sheboygan for the Restaurant Group and then decided he didn't want to be in the restaurant business his whole life. He enrolled at a local community college and transferred to the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee and graduated with a degree in accounting and business. He met a friend who was in Rotary who was in the real estate business. He tried his hand at real estate for the next two years, starting as an agent and then the office manager.

During this time he got divorced. He met Pat in 1999, she asked him to dance and they've been together ever since. They were married in 2003.

He was recruited by the Kohler Company to run their real estate division and he remained there for 7-8 years.

Pat was a nurse at a local health organization. She left her job and they decided she would apply for a job in Arizona, where they already has a home. She started working for Banner Hospice in 2014 while Jim remained at Kohler and then returned to Mesa for good in 2015.







He worked part-time in Student Services at Rio Salado College until December of 2019 when he retired for the third time. Jim and Pat love to travel. His name finally came up after 21 years on the coveted list for season tickets for the Green Bay Packers. With their move to Mesa, they couldn't make all the games; however, they still go to some games during the season.
