Gus has also been involved with the Rotary Club of North Adelaide being president from 1996-1997.

Gus is a dedicated family man and has been married for 49 years, has 3 children and 7 grandchildren.

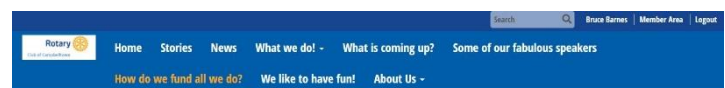


• **Secretary Susan’s announcements**

The recipient of this award has been a wonderful support to the club and to her husband and to Rotary in general.

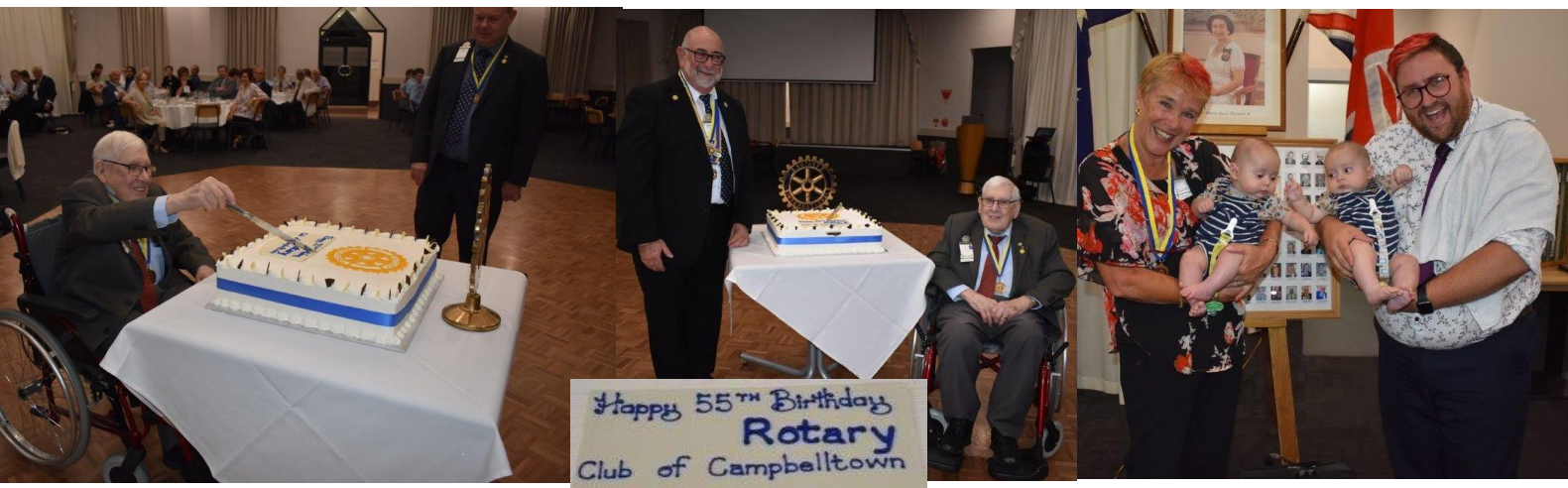


This person:

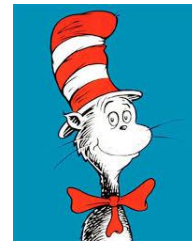
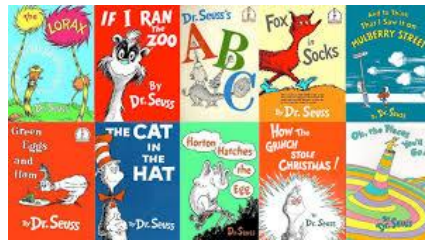
