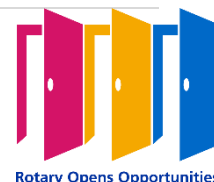

David Binks - The Man Behind A Boating Tradition

David Binks is a well-known and highly respected Rotarian and has been a member of the Rotary Club of Glenelg for over 50 years. During this time, David has been Club President on three occasions and served on numerous District management committees, giving invaluable advice on Youth Exchange Protection issues.

David's career as a boat builder has also been highly distinguished. His racing yachts have won many National and International Championships. David was a pioneer in the introduction of fibreglass in boatbuilding and designed and built many world-class cruising yachts. David has received many awards from the boating industry, highlighted by a Medal of the Order of Australia in 2013 for his services to sailing.

Recently, an enthralling biography of David's life, *Casting Off Tradition*, has been published by Wakefield Press. The book is on sale for \$40. **Part proceeds from book royalties will help fund youth development voyages aboard the majestic tall ship *One and All*.** [Link Here](#)

David Binks OAM made his first craft from a single wooden plank and when he began his boatbuilding apprenticeship in Port Adelaide at 17, David learnt the age-old technique of working with plank and rib.

But within a year, the possibilities of fiberglass gripped his imagination and changed the boating world.

David was at the forefront of the international revolution of boatbuilding and racing in Australia.

Trevor Gill's biography captures David's vision ingenuity and multitude of achievements, with his racing yachts winning National and World Championships.

But it also explores the drama, adventure and colourful characters in David's life, including his exploits on a Churchill Fellowship world Tour, being shipwrecked in the North Sea and, after a fire destroyed his Adelaide factory, embarking on new ventures - building world-class cruising yachts with the legendary designer Bruce Farr.

Not only is this a fascinating book, but proceeds from the book royalties will fund a project which David strongly supports - Youth development voyages aboard the tall ship 'One and All.'

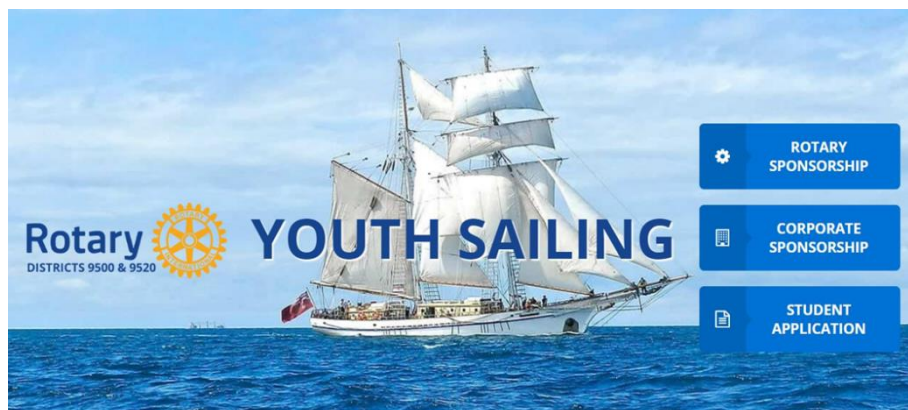
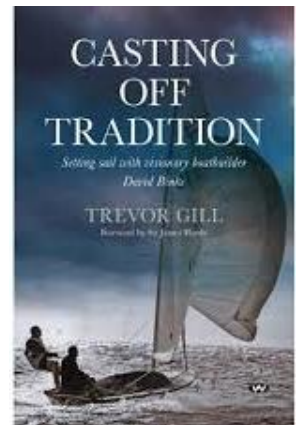

- **David then spoke on the Sailing Challenge**



David spoke on how the book really started it all for the sailing challenge.

Back in 2017 the publisher Wakefield Press and author of his biography Trevor Gill offered to donate part proceeds of the book to a charity of his choice. So David setup the 5 day sail and challenge. "It has gone so well and far better than I ever dreamed".

Since the beginning Rotary Clubs have sponsored some 50 students at a cost of \$55K. The cost for each student for the Challenge is just under \$1K at \$950 but the actual cost is \$1,100. The difference is helped with proceeds from the sale of the book and fundraising/sponsorship/ public sail days etc. From the sale of each \$40 book, \$17 goes into the program.

Due to covid this year's April Challenge was cancelled but we have approval to go ahead, at this stage with a voyage from Sept 27 -1 Oct 2020 and another from 11-14 April 2021.

David then spoke on how Clubs can sponsor and select students. An ideal student is someone who is a little shy and can be challenged to reach their full potential. The Club needs to fill out an application form and the student as well. To show their commitment we ask potential students to pay \$25 of their own, the rest is covered. Clubs can select their own students but due to the earlier April cancellations we already have some potential students who have applied and need club sponsorship.

David then invited Rose Clayton a former successful student of the Challenge to speak on her experiences.

- Rose said she did the challenge in 2018 and it was a life changing positive experience for her, making her much more confident and she no longer shies away from challenges and now enjoys leadership roles.

Back in 2018 when she applied she did not know much about it Sailing let alone the Sailing Challenge. Similarly other students elected for the challenge thought it would simply be a expedition cruise where you could sleep in and be very relaxing etc. Well it was much more than that and a real challenge at

the time but the benefits in looking back were amazing.

Initially everyone was divided into three groups, named after 3 parts of the ship, each assigned different tasks and duties to be done on a four hour rotating shift with the goal to learn how to practically, run and sail an ocean going ship independently all within the 5 days. They were shown rope work, rigging, climbing the loft, using a safety harness, taking watch, cleaning toilets, and scrubbing decks, setting the sails etc. and getting on and working together with everyone as a team. It was hard work but it paid off. She shared some of her most memorable moments :- Her team's first early morning 12am-4am shift on watch ,pitch black and cold still night and seeing a pod of Dolphins at the bow of the ship in the fluorescent and glowing water-an incredible and memorable moment; of climbing the loft and being challenged to go higher to the top than she ever imagined

thus overcoming her fears and pushing her boundaries; nothing being more peaceful than to be in the middle of the ocean with nature ; of the fellowship and camaraderie on board and great friendships made ;of being challenged and mentored to get you through; of working together as a team ; of seeing the sun and moon rising and setting over the ocean especially seeing a rare full blood moon setting ; of yelling instructions to other crew members and the simple joy of sailing on the breeze ;of taking on the leader's role in her team and commanding the ship into Pt Lincoln and feeling so competent

after an amazing 5 days on the expedition; of seeing other students really gain in confidence and reach their potential and yes despite some early sea sickness, after being advised to focus on the horizon they soon got over it.

She is so thankful for taking part and very thankful to David, for having the vision to implement this

fantastic life experience and challenge, and the crew plus all those involved with the One and All making it all possible.

After the cruise when she returned to yea 12 she had a new found passion and wanted to pursue a leadership role and is now in her second year of nursing and loves her work and enjoys new challenges and experiences.

At the conclusion of their talk Chair Brad thanked and presented them with a small gift in appreciation of their most informative and *interesting talks.*

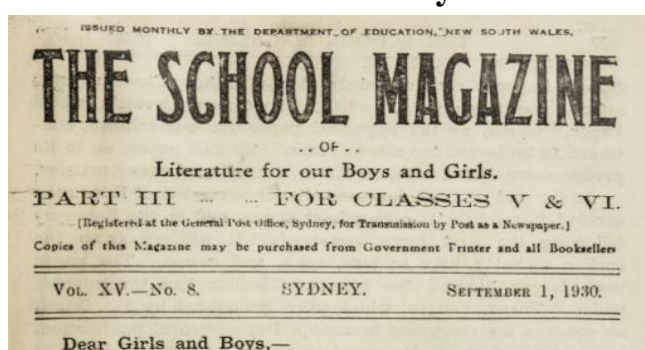

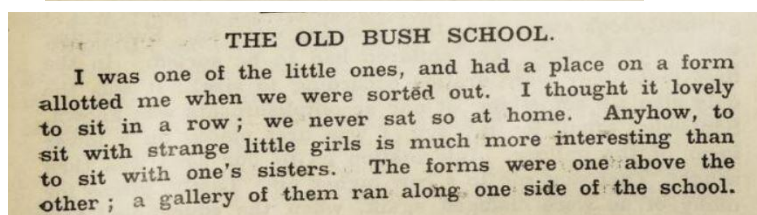

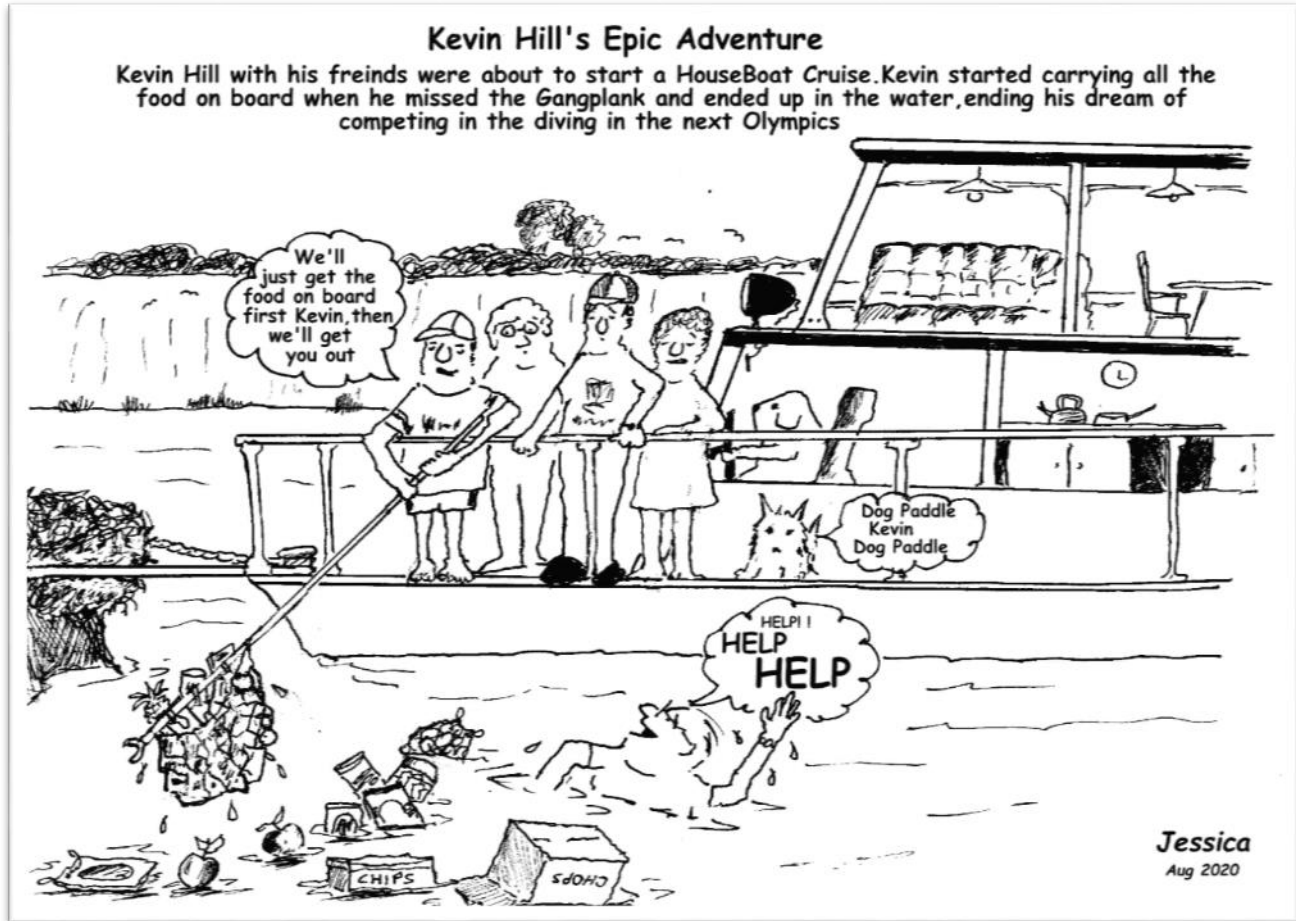

Recipe Corner-From "An Apple a Day"

-A SACWA Members Recipes Cookbook –Cost \$12

Apple Roses

Ingredients

1 red apple
 Boiling water
 Cinnamon and sugar



1 lemon (juiced)
 1 sheet puff pastry

Method

Wash apple (skin on) cut in half and remove seeds and core. Slice thinly to make half circles. Sprinkle with lemon juice and cover with boiling water for 3 minutes. Cut pastry in half. Layer apple slices so they are protruding over the edge of pastry. Fold remaining pastry over apple and roll up loosely. Place in baking dish apple side up. Can be sprinkled with cinnamon and sugar. Allow enough room for pastry to puff. Serve with cream or ice-cream. *Lavinia Trezise, Waikerie*

Alternative Method (courtesy [Taste .com.au](http://Taste.com.au))

Ingredients

1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice
 1 pink lady apple (or red apple)
 50-70g butter, melted
 1 tablespoon brown sugar

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 5 sheets filo pastry (see Note)
 Icing sugar, to serve

Step 1

Preheat oven to 200C or 180C fan-force. Grease a mini muffin tin.

Step 2

Place juice in a medium microwave safe bowl. Halve apple and remove core. Cut into 1mm thin slices, placing them as you go in the lemon juice. Top up with water to just cover slices. Microwave, covered, on high (100%) for 2 minutes. Drain well and place on a large plate to cool (apple must keep its shape but be flexible).

Step 3

Combine butter, sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl.

Step 4

Working with 1 sheet at a time, brush filo sheet with butter mixture. Fold lengthways in two and in two again to achieve a long strip. Cut in half. Brush pastry with butter mixture. Arrange 7-8 apples slices, overlapping along the top long edge, just slightly overhanging pastry (apples will slide out slightly when you roll the pastry). Roll pastry to form a rose. Place, apple side up, in prepared tin. Repeat with remaining pastry, butter mixture and apple to form 10 roses. Bake for 30 minutes or until pastry is golden and cooked through.
