On Saturday we had our last Monthly Sale for the current Rotary Year. My thanks to members, partners and friends of Rotary, for their help throughout the year. As special thank you to Renata and Bill Allan for the hours they spend in the Shed each and every week keeping the Shed's engine oiled and running smoothly.

Online sales were slow this month, but still realised \$1020. On the day we raised \$3384-50 making a total of \$4404-50 for the month.



- **Jeff Blanco as Chair of the Club's second Classics Car Show held on Sunday 28th March, announced that tonight, the Club was presenting cheques of \$5000 each to representatives of three local CFS Clubs -Athelstone, Montacute and Ashton.** This was money raised for the CFS at the show which was a great success and received outstanding support by the car enthusiasts, the public, Council, and sponsors.



Initially the Car Show was planned for Nov 20 but due to covid this was delayed till March 21. As the Show was in aid of the CFS it was thought in Nov 20 that the money was really needed before the fire season, and so it was decided to donate \$5000 to the Athelstone CFS then and the balance after the Show. So in March 21 we raised an outstanding \$15,000 (the organising committee was hoping for \$10,000), 3X what we raised in our first show. A great outcome. We then decided to give the Athelstone CFS another \$5000 and share the other \$10000 equally between two other deserving CFS units, namely Montacute & Ashton. The \$5000 Cheques were presented to each unit by representatives of the Car Show Committee- Bruce Barnes (secretary) Sam Zullo , President Vince and Car Show Director Jeff Blanco.






