- thanked everyone who attended the District Conference last weekend and those who came to the Marion Hotel Dinner last Friday night.
- Stephany also spoke on her future Board and was pleased to announce her latest Board vacancy was filled by Damian Leach. Thank you Damian & her other Board members.
- Steph also introduced her Directors who then individually announced their committees.



- **Damian Leach** gave a wrap up on last weekend's District Conference held at Marion then a report on his recent Rotary duties & activities, and:-
- How great was the District conference?

I think our club can quite rightfully be proud of the most recent conference, given our significant opposition when it was proposed to not have a district conference in the early days of the merging of our two districts.

I am confident our substantial, considered contribution persuaded those leading those discussions to rethink their suggestion and ensure one of the highlights of our Rotary year stayed put.

I am sure many Rotarians across our District would be saying the same thing as they report back to their clubs also, and I am sure that the next one will be even better.

I was particularly impressed at the conference with the presentation by Dr Melanie Bagg about the National Youth Science Forum's innovative way of running their program in a covid-19 environment.

I think at times it is important for the club to know what I am up to when I am not here, as I realise I can be away quite a bit.

Certainly, my Rotary International and District duties have been constant, however, I didn't anticipate having such an active involvement in the delivery of RYPEN this year, which

necessitated my taking leave to be able to do well. I'd like to thank the club for its approval of my leave.

As some may recall when we discussed the merger of the districts in our club, there is an ongoing discussion throughout our region as we form larger districts due to falling membership... with the intention to go from approximately 27 to around 17.

One of the activities I have been involved with is the merger of the New Zealand districts to form one district, District 9999 from July 2022. This has included weekend-long meetings with Past RI Directors, Past District Governors, G-Train and team leaders from the various districts to try to form a path forward for these districts, as they unite in their service.

My role is not only to provide advice on the merger, but also to assist in the negotiations between the various parties. My experience leading the merger of the 18 youth programs in our current district has assisted in this greatly.

Youth Programs- This fortnight is probably the busiest of my Rotary year, given my committees delivered the Sailing Experience last week, and are delivering RYLA commencing on Thursday for a week, and RYPEN commencing on Friday for a four day program which is the first time it has been this length in many years. I'd like to thank the club for its ongoing support for these programs which make a significant difference in the lives of many young people. I can advise the club that over 120 young people will have participated in the youth programs I mentioned, including 67 at RYPEN alone, one of the largest programs we have held.

This program has continued to grow under the chairmanship of our own Liz Gardner, and the financial stewardship of Margaret Beare.

These are the first Youth programs to be delivered in District 9510.

I'd like to encourage members to support our RYLA candidates through attendance at the Graduation Dinner, the invitation was circulated to clubs about a fortnight ago.

It is always a great night and this year will be held at the Glenelg Golf Club. This be the first Graduation of District 9510, with the Leadership Manager (formerly known as the Lead Director), being our own alumnus, Dylan Mackay, otherwise known as Tink.

In addition, I'd like to thank those members of the club which are involved in making RYPEN happen this year. Particularly, Margaret Northcote who has been Registrar of RYPEN AGAIN, Hans and Ruth Graf who will be the Host Parents, and Liz Gardner and Maria Figg who are organising the BBQ on Friday night.

It is through our club's generous service, both in hand and in sponsorship, that make these programs as successful as they are.

I imagine that Steph is feeling a sense of relief given these are the first youth leadership programs she hasn't been Chair of since 2015.

We have so many of our members which contribute at District level. particularly our younger members, and it is something our club can be proud of. I know across the district, many clubs are envious of the engagement of our younger members.

District Assembly Sunday 2 May at PAC

As a member of the District Learning and Development Committee, I encourage all members to attend the District Assembly. It is an fabulous opportunity to learn more and be able to provide more service in our community, and enjoy it in the friendship of each other.

The Rotary Foundation

"Make no little plans," American architect Daniel Burnham said. "They have no magic to stir [our] blood and probably themselves will not be realized."

When Rotary heeds Burnham's advice and follows through with action, we shine. We made big plans when we spearheaded a global initiative to eradicate polio; and last year the World Health Organization's African region was certified polio-free.

When the coronavirus hit about a year ago, The Rotary Foundation quickly mobilized and awarded 319 COVID-19-specific disaster response grants for \$7.9 million.

To date, it has further awarded 317 COVID-19 global grants for about \$24.1 million, which, combined with previously approved global grants that were repurposed to support corona-virus response, has made for a total contribution of more than \$32.7 million.

Once again, this year the Rotary Foundation received the highest rating from Charity Navigator, Four Stars, for the twelfth year in a row. This rating verifies that The Rotary Foundation exceeds industry standards and outperforms most charities in our area of work.

It is an exceptional designation which sets the Foundation apart from its peers and demonstrates to the public its trustworthiness.

Our club has never made little plans. We think big. We are a generous club, and we have had an ongoing and substantial relationship with OUR Foundation, the Rotary Foundation.



On Saturday morning at the Foundation breakfast at the Conference, I was thrilled to receive on the club's behalf, an acknowledgement by the Rotary Foundation for our Club's substantial contribution over many years, with our receiving a Bronze Citation for the donation of cumulatively over \$100,000 USD to the Foundation.




