 - The Art Show is going well, and Michael will report on it later tonight.


Secretary Susan Harris had some announcements: -

Community Director Elizabeth Gagliardi spoke on the Salvation Army's Red Shield Appeal.

The Covid - 19 Pandemic has no discrimination of race, creed or religion and does not spare where you are and where you come from.

Even the young are vulnerable. Today the epicenter is India.



The media described it as a Tsunami. 400,000 daily cases and a daily death rate of 4000.

This I understand is under recorded.

Hospitals are running out of medical supplies, beds, oxygen and medical staff and volunteers are stretched to their limits working 24 / 7.

Crematoriums are also stretched beyond words. Furnaces melting, bodies are lined up for a basic performance of last rites and they are running out of firewood.

David Dante Bandini is the Managing Director of Avanti Pasticceria, a 3rd generation Family ownedand run Italian patisserie with baking is in his blood, flour in his hair and a smile on his face.

David was born in Adelaide and grew up and currently resides in the Campbelltown City Council suburb of Paradise. David is married to Jo-Ann and is the proud father to Isabella.

David spent the majority of his upbringing around food, Italian food, be it pasta or pastries, or whether it was preparing it with his Mum (Lidia Bandini) or Nonna (Maria Luigia Mercurio) or whether it was enjoying the fruits of their labour with friends and family or watching the faces of customers light up when they first see the cakes they have come to collect from the bakery. David learnt early on the joy that sharing food, especially good food, brings. As was customary within a family business, David spent weekends and school holidays at the bakery, happily helping and contributing to put smiles on the faces of their customers.

After graduating from St. Ignatius College and attending Flinders University, David learnt his trade in the industry under the tutelage of his Mother and Father (Lidia and Romano Bandini). However, David's tutelage also included the fundamentals of managing a family business with family and non family employees.

David succeeded his parents management in 1997 and with this indispensable knowledge and training passed down to him, David has been able to grow the business from 6 employees to 20 employees and more than tripling the customer base and turnover and was instrumental in restructuring, modernising and re-branding Avanti Pasticceria, but a couple of things have never changed, their families trusted authentic recipes and their commitment to gratefully give back to the community.

Since 1964 Avanti Pasticceria's secret has been our family's love for the joy of sharing our food with others. For 57 years the Avanti Pasticceria family has been at our customer's table to help celebrate their families milestones from Baptisms to Birthdays or Weddings to Anniversaries. The significance of this simple fact is not lost on David with long held, loyal customers often informing David how his Nonna (Luigia) made their Engagement Cake, then David's Mum and Dad (Lidia & Romano) made their Childs Baptism cake and now David is called upon to make their 50th Wedding Anniversary Cake.

Avanti Pasticceria is primarily a wholesale bakery, supplying Cafes, Restaurants, Gourmet foods stores, Supermarkets, Function centres, Caterers, local and interstate distributors with traditional continental cakes, pastries, biscuits and taralli.

David spends his days in the bakehouse elbow deep in flour and in the office knee deep in paperwork, with the phone never far from his ear. David believes it is important for the manager to



have close relationships with his wholesale customers considering them part of the Avanti family

and calling upon them regularly so as to not lose touch with what is an ever-changing industry.

David's vision for the future of Avanti Pasticceria is simple, give bake (sorry back) to the community when he can and keep putting smiles on the faces of their customers.

• Chair Tony Lagozzino introduced guest speaker Adj Professor Nicola Sasssanelli AO.

Nicola graduated from the University of Bari, Italy in 1987 with a degree in Electronic Engineering. He went on to work as a researcher in microelectronics high-reliability components at Tecnopolis S&T Research Centre, Bari before being appointed as Scientific Attaché at the Embassy of Italy in Canberra from 2001 to 2008.

In 2009, Nicola joined the South Australian Government as a Special Envoy for higher education research and technology transfer to Europe and later became Director for International R&D Collaborations.

From 2003 to 2013 he was appointed as Adjunct Professor of Science and Technology at the University of Canberra, Australia, and in 2007 he became an Honorary Member of the Order of Australia.

In September 2017 the South Australian Space Industry Centre was created with Nicola as Director. His focus was to support space industry growth and increase international R&D collaborations in South Australia's space sector.

In 2018 Nicola was appointed Adjunct Professor at the University of South Australia – Division of Information Technology, Engineering and the Environment and he was appointed on the board of the Space Industry Association of Australia. In the same year he was also appointed to the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic by the Italian Government for 'promoting high-tech industry and R&D collaborations between Italy and Australia'.

In 2019 Nicola joined SmartSat Cooperative Research Centre as Director of Communication and Outreach, becoming Senior Advisor of South Australian Space Industry Centre.

Astronaut Andy helping kids aim for the stars

ADELAIDE'S own astronaut, Andy Thomas, has launched a South Australian-based space foundation – named in his honour – to capitalise on the city becoming home to the Australian Space Discovery Centre.

Backed by \$900,000 in State Government funding, the Andy Thomas Space Foundation will encourage space study in SA, begin-

ning in primary school. It will offer scholarships for international training and industry experience.

Dr Thomas described the foundation as a "great milestone" that would open "myriad options" for young people to become inspired about space.

"It will help them define their future career goals and help establish them on a good education path," Dr Thomas said from the US, where earlier this week he watched his wife, Shannon Walker, and three other astronauts leave on a NASA/ SpaceX mission to the International Space Station.

Foundation chief executive Nicola Sasanelli said long-term funding would come from membership fees, philanthropic donations, grants and revenue from public events.

Premier Steven Marshall was to

launch the Foundation at Lot 14 this morning but, because of COVID-19 restrictions, instead issued a statement hailing the new foundation as "a great asset to supporting the State Government's commitment to growing SA's space industry".

Mr Sasanelli said the foundation aimed to generate career opportunities for SA school leavers and promote local innovation and economic growth.

In 2020 Nicola founded the Andy Thomas Space Foundation, of which he is now CEO. (Clipping of the Article above dated 20th Nov 20 is courtesy of the Advertiser)

Nicola's main passion, outside of his interest in space, is painting.

• Mr. Nicola Sasssanelli AO then gave a presentation on Australia in Space and his role as CEO of the Andy Thomas Space Foundation.

- SA has a long history of involvement with Space and Astronomical Research and Development. In 1947 the Woomera Rocket Range was established by the Dept of Defense and was used by Europe, the UK and USA for tests. In 1967 Satellites were launched from Woomera and it is now still actively used for testing and development of rocket technology, hardware and space technology.
- O The opportunities of space & the space industry -is growing every year. Previously, the space industry was mostly govt funded, but today it is funded substantially by private business and corporations. There are so many opportunities eg Satellite broadband; GPS; providing satellite technology or "the internet of things", for agriculture, fisheries, crisis response, environment, defense, cybersecurity, health, space careers, research etc.....
- Nicola is a sa senior advisor to <u>The South Australian Space Industry Centre</u> which was created in 2017. It's vision is to create a space enabled economy and increase awareness of the opportunities of space.....
- o In closing Nicola, founder and CEO of the Andy Thomas Space Foundation spoke on :-
 - ➤ It's vision? Inspiring the next generation of space leaders.
 - ➤ It's mission? To promote social well-being and overcome disadvantage in





Australia and to advocate in favour of space as a domain for international cooperation and peaceful co-existence.

> It's purpose?

Advancing Space Education – Making STEM literacy for all students an educational priority. Raising Space Awareness – Making connections between space science and technologies and our everyday lives.

Contributing to the national space community

— Through events and other education initiatives

At the conclusion of Nicola's most interesting presentation of Australia in Space , followed by question time President Vince presented him a cheque for \$1000 for the Andy Thomas Foundation . Nicola was very thankful on behalf of the foundation and it would be most welcome .


