- Unless Notified Otherwise if you are attending a meeting you are assumed to be having a meal for catering purposes. 

#### • Chair Elizabeth Gagliardi introduced guest speaker Michael Rossi.

Michael Rossi is Elizabeth's nephew and is the Marketing Manager for <u>The Bend Motorsport Park</u> and took on the job in March 2018 just weeks before the Venue formallly opened.

Michael has 15 + years marketing and advertising experience, specialising in sport an automotive sectors, including time with Adelaide United Sports Club, Hyundai Australia and BMW. Tonight he will speak on the latest developments at The Bend Motorsport Park.



Michael said it was a pleasure to speak on The Bend Motorsport Park at Tailem Bend. It was his job to explain what The Bend was all about and encourage members to try it out and visit to see what it has to offer. He showed a photo of his two young daughters at the track on toy cars. One loves all the cars and the other says it's too noisy. When the opportunity came up to get involved with the Marketing of The Bend it was something he couldn't resist. The Bend Motorsport Park is an award winning, state of the art, world-class motorsport facility, with a range of event spaces and exhilarating experiences suitable for 20 to 200+ guests. The investment is + \$ 110 million of private

money, with State and Federal support as well. It's a 750 Ha site and is at the intersecton of the Mallee and Dukes Hwy and one hour from the bottom of the freeway and it is definitely worth the drive. Construction began in November 2016 and opened to the public in 2018, It was 95% constructed by SA companies and 100% Australian. Developed and primarily funded by the Peregrine Corporation (OTR) South Australia's largest private company, owned by the Shahin family.

Th precincts still to come are a Drag Strip , an airsrtrip , a Business park and a Community Development. We recently had the Supercarsa few weeks ago. We had just 3 weeks to prepare for it that would normally take 6 months, but thanks to Covid the opportunity came our way and we were able to make the most of it and it was a fantastic event for all involved. There is motorcycle racing, local grass roots racing and all sorts and it is only going to get bigger and it is our intention to get the best events in Australia and in fact the world. The racetrack has been built to handle that. For Business you don't need to be in cars to to come and enjoy what the venue has to offer. As part of our mission our job is not to just promote The Bend but to promote Tailem Bend , the local region, the Murray River Lakes and Coorong to the World. Thanks to the Bend there has been a significant amount of development. Eg Out of the Super Car Event Hotels & accomadation within a 50-100Km radius of The Bend were fully booked. That is doing great things within the Region, with Mum & Dad businesses , entrepreneurs, property investors who have taken a gamble on Tailem Bend as a result of The Bend Motorsport Park and it is already starting to pay off.

Michael showed a presentation of what The Bend has to offer and are certainly fully open for business . This includes a 4WD park , a Rally section, A Big4 Holiday Park , a full motor racing circuit, stadium circuit (for gocart , drifting and rally cross). We have a 100 room Hotel uniquely on Pit Lane.

The track has certainly put SA and The Bend on the World Stage. There are mutiple configurations . On the first Super Car Event event they had over 50,000 people over 3 days it was extroardinary. There are some stunning cars in the Hotel foyer Welcome Centre that are on display seven days a week – everything from Brock race cars , classics, modern day supercars , effectively a museum . You never know what you will see when you come for a visit or for a coffee , lunch or dinner or stay the night. Such is the size of The Bend project not only can you race cars and people can bring their own cars but we are also going to sell cars. But not just any old cars , but the best cars you can buy. For instance there is a McClaren their at the moment price tag \$2.75 mill and Michael said he would love to sell it to a Rotarian.

It is not all about fun as they do offer Corporate experiences and even bookings for upcoming Christmas parties where you can stay the night and relax afterwards and not rush to drive home.



Hotel rates are reasonable, especially out side of events. There is an great restaurant in the Hotel but due to covid restrictions is only open Thursdays to Sunday. Michael spoke on other aspects of The Bend. It is family friendly, there are track days for beginners, a training program for young drivers, driver and ride experiences, there are memberships available, you can buy gift vouchers for different events and experiences, and so much more......



The Homemade Rose Syrup Recipe is a simple recipe with no additives, coloring or preservatives. The rose syrup is made from fresh rose petals, that are dried and then made into a syrup by boiling it in water. You can also use a store dried petals to make the rose syrup. The Rose Syrup can be used in Ice creams, Milkshakes or Juices or even made into the classic Rose Milk for summers.

Cuisine: Indian Equipment's Used: Preethi Blue Leaf Mixer Grinder, Saucepan With Handle (Tea/Sauces) Prep in 15 M; Cooks in 20 M; Makes: 200 ml Servings

#### Ingredients

1/2 cup Rose Petals, dried red rose petals

2 cups Water

1 Cloves (Laung)

1-1/2 cups Sugar

#### How to make How to Make Homemade Rose Syrup Recipe

To begin making the homemade rose syrup recipe, we will first clean and dry the fresh rose petals. Skip the following process if you are using store bought dried rose petals.

If they are fresh petals then clean rose petals in running water. Dry the rose petals completely and place them on kitchen paper towels. We will dry the rose petals in room temperature on the paper towels. The process of drying will take a couple of days. After a couple of days, you will notice the rose petals have become crisp and dry. When you touch them they will break apart.

Once the petals are dry, we are ready to make the rose syrup. If you bought the store bought petals you can use it at this stage.

Boil the water in a saucepan. Place the petals in a glass bowl and pour the boiled water on top of the petals, stir for a few seconds. Allow the rose petals to rest in the water until the water cools down. Once the petals cool down, refrigerate the petals and water filled bowl for 12 to 15 hours.


Next day, strain the water into a saucepan (your rose water will be dark red). Place the saucepan on medium heat. Add the sugar and clove to the rose water. Keep stirring to dissolve the sugar. As it heats up you will the water frothing on the top.

Gradually the foam will go away as the water begins to boil. Once the water begins to boil, turn the heat to low and simmer for 10 minutes and turn off the heat.

Allow the Rose Syrup to cool completely. The syrup will thicken as it cools down.

The Rose Syrup is now ready to be used in Ice creams, Milkshakes or Juices or even the classic Rose Milk. You can store the Rose Syrup in a glass bottle and refrigerate it for at least 2 months.
